If you wanted a debate on life, religion or politics, a better combatant you could not find and winning most of the debates at K o's Barber Shop on the "Avenue" was Erwin's joy, not to mention family dinners.

Erwin became very active in his adult life at Trinity Episcopal serving many, many years as Junior and Senior Warden. Betty remembers demanding a separate phone line in the house to handle his parish calls. He loved it and his teammates including Pansy & Leroy Swan, Betty Yarborough, Jean and Charles Steede, Velma Johnson and Pearle Anderson to name a few.

A man of valor ahead of his time states his wife. Erwin suffered a long and debilitating illness, but kept his faith and humor.

He leaves to morn, Betty, his Wife of 48 years, a sister, Lorraine and a brother, Harold. Also, his adored nieces, nephews, godsons and a host of relatives and friends.
