**Charlotte Terrell Sapp** was born on July 11, 1967 to the late Mary Sapp and Ernest Sapp in Bronx, New York. She entered into eternal rest on January 9, 2018.

Charlotte was an active member of Creston Avenue Baptist Church of Christ, where she served in various ministries, such as the choir and the usher board. In 2011, Charlotte began to serve as Community Liaison and Outreach Coordinator to Pastor Marcia E. Stanley until her transition. In this capacity, Charlotte organized and coordinated Creston's Annual Community Day Block Party/Street Fair, attended various community meetings and events, and served as liaison between the 46th Precinct Community Council, Community Board 5, and several elected officials within the Fordham-Burnside and University Heights communities. As Creston's Outreach Evangelism Ministry leader, Charlotte and her team ministered in our local community nursing homes, shelters and neighboring street corners.

In 2016, Charlotte worked as a Outreach Specialist for ACMH.

In 2017, Charlotte was employed as Clergy Liaison to Assemblyman, Victor Pichardo. Her responsibilities included, connecting services of the assemblyman with the neighboring churches and Mosques. From this union, the 2017 Bronx Job Fair was organized in partnership with Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, Assemblyman Pichardo, and the NYS Department of Labor where 40+ businesses met at the Creston Avenue Baptist Church accepting resumes from potential employees. Also from this union, came the birth of our community International Day of Peace: "March for Peace Not Violence", where clergies, Muslims, local businesses, community residents and organizations came together for a good cause.

In early January of 2018, Charlotte began her new job at the Jewish board.

Charlotte graduated Martin Luther King, Jr. High School in Manhattan and is the Founder of a nonprofit organization called Women In Progress, which services women who were previously incarcerated.

Charlotte was very well loved. Although, the youngest, she often acts like the oldest making sure her siblings are cared for. Charlotte loves to praise the Lord which was a major part of her personality. Charlotte was kind, caring and gentle, but make no mistake, she would not hesitate to tell it like it was.

Charlotte leaves to cherish her memories: her daughters, Juandisha Sapp, Charrice Alas, and Zané Spraggs; grandchildren, Tariya Sapp and Tyree Sapp; father, Ernest Sapp; sister, Celeste Sapp; brother, Charles Echols; nieces, Chonte Sapp and Shamika Taylor; a great-niece, Aniyah Sapp; a nephew, Sean Starks; along with a host of cousins, friends, and church family.
