Julian made a mean corn bread and golden fried chicken that could have won any competition, He loved writing poetry and drawing and was excellent at it. He spent most of his time praying and reading the Bible. He had a peace about him that radiated the atmosphere it was the peace of God that passes all understanding. Words cannot express the love I have for him he will be missed by all his friends and family. Julian has moved to his new home in heaven, but his memories will always live on in our hearts, I thank God for giving us such a wonderful human-being take your rest Julian we will meet again some- day.
