James Luther Henderson, Jr. affectionately known as "Jimmy", "Unc", "Pop" and "June Bug" was born in Toledo, Ohio on June 11, 1949 to the late James L. Henderson, Sr. and Johnnie Mae Stanfield. He was the eldest of two children.

James attended grade school while being raised by his grandparents, John and Katie Stanfield. When James completed his education, he moved to Newark, New Jersey where he attended Central High School. He was an exceptional student. As well, he participated in various activities such as softball, managing the basketball team and a superb drum major. In 1967, James graduated from Central High School and attended one of the nations historical black colleges, Lincoln University. There at Lincoln he made many friends and participated in various activities until he graduated in 1971 with a B.A. degree in Psychology. James had such a passion for learning and exploring the history of the African-American culture that he enrolled into Seton Hall and began pursuing a Masters Degree in Black Studies under the professorship of Gil Noble. Due to family obligations James was unable to fulfill the obligation and left school, shy of 19 credits. However, it did not stop him from taking an occasional class here and there during the summers at Princeton University.

James met the love of his life, Ernestine Darden and was married by Rev. Henry Jenkins in their living room in the presence of family and close friends on August 23, 1975. Through this union one child was born, Jeri Aisha.

James was no stranger to hard work. He worked several different jobs within his lifetime. He worked for Englehart, Zepp Industries and New York City Transit Authority, where he retired in March 2008 after 30 years of dedicated services as a Bus Operator. During his days off when he was employed he volunteered as a teacher with the Christian Board of Education at Union Baptist Church. During his volunteering he helped many adults fulfill their requirements to received there GED Diplomas. He taught math classes on Monday nights.

James had many hobbies. He loved BBQing during the summers. James and Ernestine entertained many family and friends with his ribs, roast pork and other tasty edibles. As well, James loved westerns. Some of his favorites were, The Magnificant Seven, The Alamo, She Wore a Yellow Ribbon and anything with John Wayne. Every day he sat in his chair and watched Gunsmoke. He was also a music lover. He loved the Blues. Such as Bobby Blue Bland and B.B. King. His favorite music artist in the R&B arena was Gladys Knight, Anita Baker, Toni Braxton and many others.

James was not a church goer. However, he did believe in the Lord. He was very knowledgeable of the Bible. One of his favorite scriptures was "If a man dies shall he live again? All the days of my appointed time will I wait, till my change comes." - Job 14:14.

On Saturday, April 11, 2020, James departed this life to be with the Lord at 4:44 a.m. in the comfort of his home surrounded by his family.
