<u>Obituary</u>

Janie was born April 11, 1933 in Hawkinsville Georgia, to George Jones and Elizabeth Parthon. Due to the "institution" of Jim Crow, the family was transplanted to Clewiston Florida, where Janie was raised as a child and a teenager. There she was immersed in the values of family, religious faith, community partnerships and the necessity to acquire an education. In 1948, Janie and her mother relocated to Brooklyn, NY (Brownsville), and shortly thereafter, experienced the worst snow storm in the 20th century.

Janie attended Prospect Heights High School, and enjoyed traveling to Harlem with girlfriends to "party" at the SAVOY ballroom. Soon thereafter, Janie met and married, Julius Gathers, through an arranged rendezvous (by a cousin) on the "A" train at the JAY street station in Brooklyn. The marriage produced two sons, Victor, and Audwin. Janie was initially a factory worker (Brownsville), and, waitress (Bed-Stuy). In the early 1960's, Janie became one of the first Black employees at Sears & Roebuck, working in the Flatbush section of Brooklyn. Specifically, she worked in the jewelry, electronic, housewares & cafeteria departments and was nicked named — "Miss SEARS" by customers and neighbors. To demonstrate her commitment to education, in March, 1992, Janie received her NEW YORK STATE HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY CERTIFICATE.

Janie enjoyed the religious camaraderie, spiritual exaltation and inspired godliness of her home church, Salem Missionary Baptist. As a member, Janie was active on various committees and faithfully attended "Salem" as long as she was physically able. When not in church, Janie was always in deep prayer and her favorite scripture was the 23rd Psalm.

Anyone who knew Janie was aware of her out-going personality, and her knack for individual self-expression. Janie was a loving mother, and Aunt who taught her own children, in addition to, her nieces and nephews, through example and instruction, how to survive and navigate societal conditions, act respectfully, and give GOD the glory.

Janie was preceded in death by her father, mother, former husband Julius, her son Audwin, her Aunts, and all her siblings, their husbands and wives: Maggie Flagg Tolbert and Rufus Tolbert, Albert Ward and Geraldine Ward, Laura Lilly Brown and Herbert Brown, Christine Goode Johnson and Robert Johnson. Nephews Leon E. Flagg, Rufus Tolbert jr., Robert Johnson, Jr., Donnie Ward; nieces Veronica Ward, Vernita Ward, Gwendolyn Johnson, and great nephews and nieces, too numerous to mention at this time.
