James Leroy Hutcherson Sr. was born on December 10th, 1926 to the Late Rev. Robert L. and Helen Hutcherson. He was the eldest son of 14 brothers and sisters. After attending Buffalo High School he served in the U.S. Army of World War II, in which he received Victory Medal of Honor.

After his honorable discharge he moved back to West Virginia with his mom and dad where he worked in the coal mines. He later decided to move to New York to make a better life for his four children. James worked for Pic Quick Foods (Key Food) for many years. He retired in 1992, and soon after that he wanted to move back to West Virginia to be close to his mother and siblings.

There he joined St. James Baptist Church of Amherstdale, West Virginia. After spending years in West Virginia, James moved back to New York with his children. He joined Burns Memorial Church in which he looked forward to attending as much as possible.
