Tessie Debose was born on July 10, 1942 in Perote, Alabama to the late Mary Bell Ligon Debose, and Richard Debose. Tessie was educated in Perote public schools and graduated from from Perote High school. At and early age Tessie was baptized and became a member of the Mt. Hillard Baptist Church in Perote Alabama where she attended with her family.

In the fall 1964 along with a few cousins, Tessie migrated to New Jersey where she spent the rest of her life making friends, and building relationships that would last through out the ages.

Tessie found employment with several companies including Electro-Catheter, Griffin Electronics, Magnus Organs, Rahway hospital, and Not Just a Daycare. After retiring, Tessie became a babysitter for many families within her community and a Caretaker for several elderly individuals. Tessie worked the Election Poles for the Union County Board of Elections, and served as superintendent of her apartment building for many years.

On a cold Sunday morning in November of 1964, after hearing a spirit filled rendition played on the piano by the late Deacon N. Newkirk, Tessie obeyed the spirit of the Lord, arose from her seat, walked down the center isle and joined the The Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church. It was at Bethlehem where Tessie would spend the next 56 years of her life blissfully dedicating both spiritual and physical service on to the Lord. Wasting no time, Tessie Immediately began working on many auxiliaries including but not limiting to the Ushers ministry (joining in 1965), Nurses Ministry, Dorcus Missionaries, Senoir Missionaries (Vice-Pres), church Anniversary Committee, and the Sunday school just to name a few. Tessie took pride in serving on all ministries but had a special love for her beloved Nurses Ministry where she served as President for many years until removed. Tessie also served faithfully on both Ushers and Nurses Department of the, New Hope Missionary Baptist Association and the General Baptist State Convention of NJ. Tessie also regularly traveled across the country attending the National Baptist Convention USA. The highlight of Tessie's convention attendees was in 2009, when she was crowned Queen of the National Baptist Convention Nurses Department.

Tessie enjoyed talking with her family and friends and had a special bond with her sisters and brother. She stayed in close contact with them and even had a subscription with the local newspaper in Union Springs, Alabama in an effort to stay current with the events of her home town.

On April 17th, 2020 Tessie finally received her orders to sit down, and rest a little while at JFK Hospital in Edison, NJ God himself withdrew the same breath he'd blew into her nostrils 77 years ago down in Perote, Al.


