Now just know if you messed with her family she's coming, and that could be dressed or even just in her girdle after you (as she actually has done). Thelma was big on forgiveness she said "learn to forgive not for the other person, but forgive to free yourself". Thelma was the cook of the century and she loved to stuff you. Everyone knows her cooking, so funny to see all the wonderful prayers and comforting messages all include, how everyone will miss her food. Her personality was infectious, she could light up a room. It's such a blessing that she lived such a long full life, for her to be able to see all the accomplishments of her kids and grandchildren and he let it be known everywhere how proud she was. At a graduation, at a cheer or dance performance, even at the closing for a house she was the only voice you heard in the room she let the world know she was proud and they were hers. In working so many jobs it was hard for her to enjoy the luxury of travel. But she made up for it after retirement, she was the knapsack of the family. "We never left home without her" you just have to say your going away, she would say "just give me the date, I'll be ready". Such a sense of humor even in days before we lost her, their was a face-time practically everyday with all the family and her granddaughter that she referred to as "My Kiyah" asked her what's the matter, Thelma stated back "she just didn't feel well" and Kiyah pressed on and said"Grandma but what's wrong and a typical Thelma-Lou moment of sarcasm had her reply "I'm Pregnant". Everyone including the nurse was hysterically laughing. In that short space of time of being in the hospital she made such an impact on the nurses they nicknames her Liberace as she refused to take off her jewelry. Her love of fashion, her obsession with shopping, decorating, those special trigger words, (those of us know exactly what they are) the sarcastic comments and just her boldness, will never be forgotten.
