Obituary

Jocelyn George Isaacs was born on June 20, 1938 in Retirement, Trelawny to his loving parents Charles and Ann Isaacs; he was the second of 8 children born to that union. Jocelyn always had a thirst for knowledge. Though he was only able to complete his Primary School studies in Jamaica, his motivation towards learning pushed him to further his education upon his migration to the United States. Through his strong dedication and drive, Jocelyn worked in the construction industry as a steelworker to provide a stable home and solid education for his six children as well as his niece Sharon to whom he was a Father figure. The buildings Jocelyn had the privilege to work on became his pride and joy and he often bragged about them.

In 1957 Jocelyn had the privilege of meeting the love of his life Daphne Monica Reid and on May 28th, 1966; the two were married thus becoming Daphne Monica Isaacs. This union produced 6 children, an adopted niece, 10 grandchildren, and one great grandchild. Jocelyn was a huge disciplinarian and he instilled his same level of hard work and family values in both his children and grandchildren.

Jocelyn's strong work ethic afforded him the opportunity to work for the Westchester Medical Center until his retirement in 2008. He was also a dedicated Deacon at Victory Seventh Day Adventist Church and served in the church's Food Pantry for several years until his wife became ill. He also found pleasure in cooking and feeding his church community, watching game shows such as the Price is Right and Jeopardy with his lovely wife, mentoring youth (introducing them to "his world"), singing, playing his harmonica, and rooting for his all-time favorite baseball team--the NY Yankees.

Jocelyn departed this life to be with the Lord on Friday, April 24, 2020 and is survived by his lovely wife of almost 54 years, Daphne Isaacs; children Donovan, Donnette, Annette, Veronica, Ewan, Talbert and adopted niece Sharon; grandchildren Dermaine, Ashley, Keshawn, Kianna, Kamoy, Jodi-Ann, Kayla, Zoe, Brandon, and Kyle; and great granddaughter Ava. He is also survived by his brothers Wilbert, Felix, Festus, and Devon; and sisters Viola, Cecelia, and Hiley, nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
