Obituary

Reflection of the life of a dedicated woman who gave of her time and substance – unstintingly - ALMA ANDERSON-SCARLETT

Alma was born to Cecil and Islyn Anderson (both now deceased) in community of Bog Walk in the parish of St. Catherine in the island of Jamaica. She was the third of eleven children. She was very helpful and generous not only at home but within the community. She was kind and caring to the elderly, also to the neighbors' children. She would share from whatever gifts she got. Her giving was selfless. Even as a child, people were drawn to her because of her charming personality.

Alma loved fashion and liked to dress up. Her mother was a seamstress and Alma would always choose her style for the first of August celebration. She loved dancing and would always win the children's competition. She had a charming personality, and she was very protective of her siblings and would act in their defense if she felt that any injustice was being meted out to them.

Alma gained her primary education at the St. Margaret's Bay Government School and later studied at the Whyte's Commercial College in Port Antonio, in the parish of Portland. Upon graduating, she was employed by the Ministry of Local Government in the Accounts department. She was a committed worker and carried out her task with excellence.

In pursuit of career goals, she migrated to the United States of America. There she enrolled at the Bronx Community College and did courses in Biology and obtained her degree. She then gained employment at Cornell Hospital in Lower Manhattan of Cornell University and Hospital (now New York Presbyterian Hospital) and was later promoted to a Supervisory position.

Despite her accomplishment, she thought she was experiencing a void in her life and as such started attending the Redeemer Lutherian Church. She was invited to Bronxwood International Church of God and after her first visit, decided to take a transfer. This led her to accept Jesus Christ as her Lord and personal Savior. She was baptized and joined the fellowship and later became an usher and served faithfully until the time of her passing. In 2012, Alma was married to Vincent Scarlett the love of her life. They were inseparable. They even dressed alike. Her husband Vincent adored her and was very committed and attentive to her in all respect. As a wife, she was very attentive and selfless. During her illness, her cousin Merna Dixon played a significant roll communicating with doctors on the family's behalf. After being in hospital for several weeks, on Saturday May 23, 2020 at 11:55 p.m. Alma went to be with the Lord. "We cannot Lord thy purpose see, but all is well that's done by Thee".
