**Francis Mensah Ocran Jr. (II)** was born on Sunday July 30, 1939 in Sekondi, Ghana to the late Mr. Francis Mensah Ocran Sr. (I) and Mrs. Winifred Ruth Asmah. He started his early schooling in Ghana and graduated from Aggrey Memorial Zion Secondary School in Cape Coast in 1959. After his graduation, Francis started working with the Ghana Information Cinema Service to educate people in the villages about country affairs. While working, Francis met Ms. Elizabeth Fynn with whom he had three children: Francis Mensah Ocran (III), the late Alex Anthony Ocran, and Winifred Berth Ocran.

Even though he was content with his life in Ghana, he strived to accomplish more for his family. Two weeks after the birth of his daughter in 1973, Francis migrated to the United States of America to pursue his dream of photography. He continued his education at the Medgar Evers College in Manhattan, New York. After he graduated from the Medgar Evers College with cum laude in business finances, he began to work with the City Comptrollers as an auditor. In July 1994, Francis Jr. became a proud grandfather when his first grandson, Francis Mensah Ocran (IV) was born on his birthday, July 30. He subsequently had two other grandchildren, Annora Frances Titus-Glover and Tyrell Aboudlrazak Fousseni. Francis Jr. continued to work with the City Comptrollers for 30+ years until he retired in 2008 to help with his granddaughter, Annora's, schooling. Through his effort, Annora became just as successful as him in school.

However, Francis' compassionate nature did not extend to only his family. His compassion for others led him to cook and sell kenkey, an African cuisine, to allow others to experience the benefits of good home-cooking on the soul. Because of this, people began to call him "obarima dokono" meaning the best male kenkey maker. Also, he helped his friends back home, sending money to fund construction projects, help with family affairs, or to give aid to anyone in need. Indeed, Francis was a problem solver, yet, if anyone wanted his help, they had to be prepared to deal with his strong determination, commonly known as his "stubbornness".

Again, this compassion and determination did not only extend to helping people on Earth, but it also extended to supporting the work of God. Through his devotion to watching Sunday services and reading the Bible, Francis Jr. embodied the true values of a Christian. As he kept the Lord in his heart, so the Lord has kept him in his grace, allowing Francis to join him in his bosom. Francis leaves his loving family and friends to mourn his death, but he also leaves his family and friends to carry on his legacy till the end of time.
