Deacon Mary Alice Bryant, 75, passed away peacefully on Monday, February 21, 2022, at Novant Forsyth Medical Center, in Winston-Salem, North Carolina after a hard-fought battle with illness. She was a loving and dedicated wife, daughter, mother, grandmother, sister, and friend.
