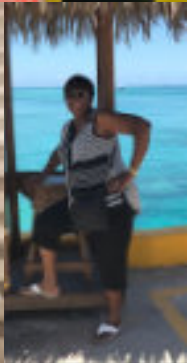
became sick they took great care of her up until her last days.
