He grew up in the old Alabama Projects where he made lifelong friendships and had fond childhood memories. Stanley was a proud Patersonian.

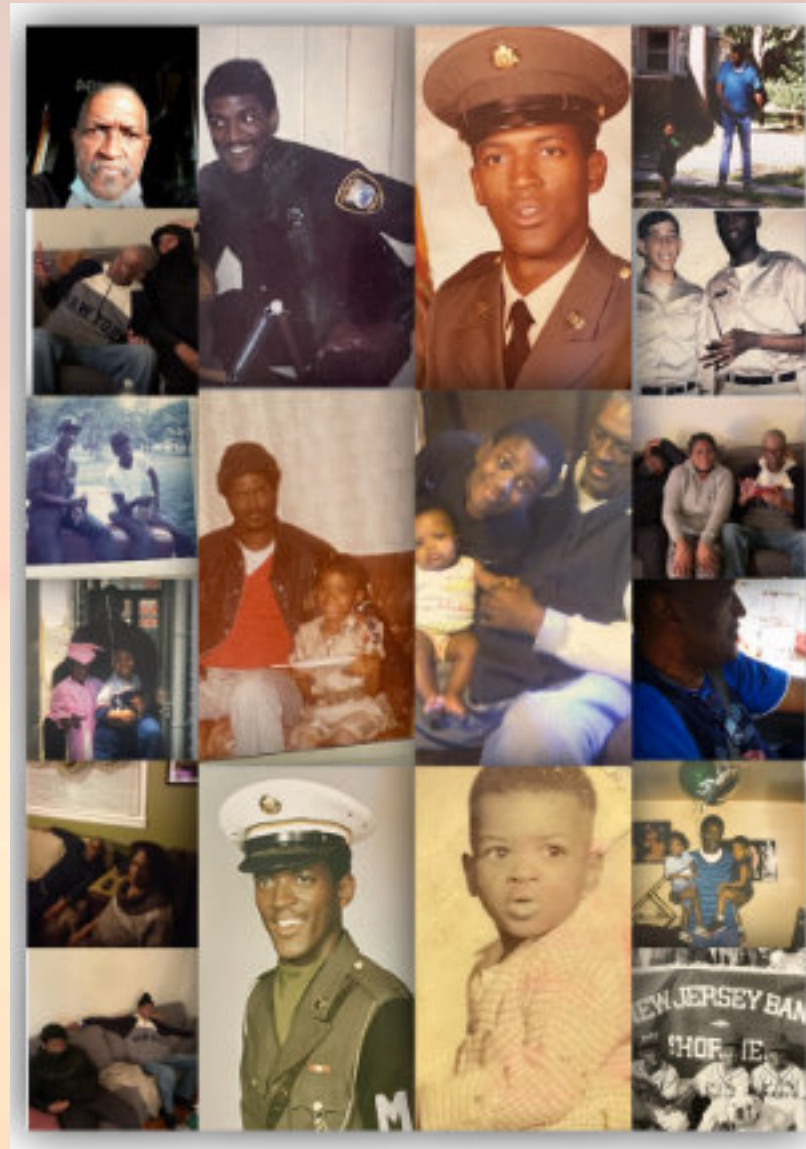
