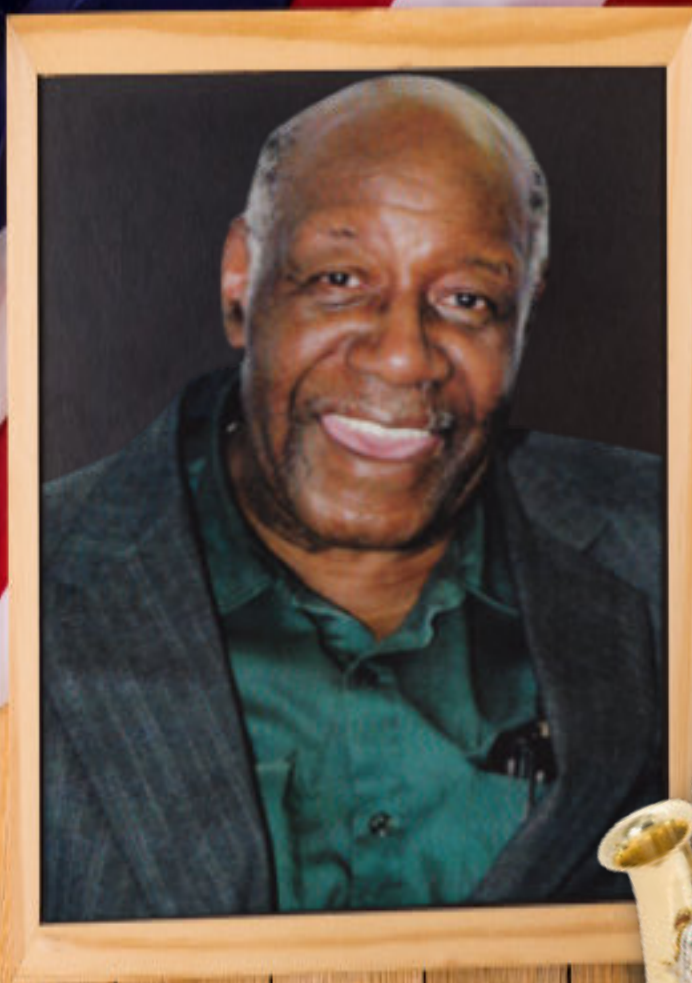

Obituary

Herbert Patterson was born in Southern Pines, North Carolina on March 14, 1929 to the late Charles Daniel Patterson and Inell Patterson. He was an only child. He peacefully transitioned to life eternal on February 26, 2022 at the New York Presbyterian-Allen Hospital.

Herbert and his mother relocated to Bronx New York in his youth. He attended New York public schools in his early childhood and later attended and graduated from Benjamin Franklin High School in 1946.

In 1950, he joined the US Army where he served proudly for two years. He was an excellent saxophonist, and he was almost immediately selected to join the 49th army band, whose main duty was to boost moral of the soldiers. He played E Flat Alto saxophone, last outfit and was stationed Salzburg, Austria.

Herbert met and married the late Delores Rice-Patterson; they had a happy marriage until her death in 2003. Most of Herbert's extended family preceded him in death.

He adopted a new family when he met his loving companion, Seneca Lannaman. Her family became his family; he considered her children and grandchildren his own. He was affectionately called "Mass Herbie" out of respect by all and he in turn always referred to Seneca as his "One and only."

Herbert was an exemplary truck driver who drove for companies such as The New York Daily News and Rhinegold Brewery. He had a big heart and often went out of his way to train many new employees to drive after his shift was over.

Herbert was well loved. He was seen as a gently giant, many were drawn to him by his friendly helpful manner. He loved his family and spent many holidays, Thanksgiving and Christmas with them; giving jokes, reciting poems he loved since high school and doing what he loves best, playing the saxophone.

Herbert's memory will be cherished by many - Seneca Lannaman, her devoted and loving children Karen and Joan; grandchildren Marc, Tiana, and Jaden whom he loved dearly and showered with unconditional love. He will be missed by many friends, loving acquaintances, and staff at Manhattanville Nursing Facility.
