Lucille Edna Black, lovingly known as Gi-Gi" to her grandchildren, was born on December 16, 1942 in Monroe, NC to Leroy and Fannie Jackson and was one of 12 siblings. She went home to be with the Lord on Friday, December 3, 2021 after being ill for a brief time. She received her education in the Elizabeth, NJ school system. At 18 years old, Lucille married her first husband Joseph Grier, Sr. From this union, there were four children: Joseph Jr., Rowland (predeceased), Troy and Tracie. Lucille loved to dance and sing. She worked as professional dancer in a dance troupe in a Supper Club. Here, she met Jimmy Hendrix who was part of the band during that time. Lucille entered a contest at the Apollo where she came in second place to a now famous R&B band. She and Joseph were divorced in 1974.

Lucille received Jesus as her Lord and Savior in 1976 at Glad Tidings Pentecostal Tabernacle Church where she was baptized. Jesus had completely transformed her life. Lucille married her second husband Willam Bernard Black in 1977. From this union, Andrea Olivette was born. Lucille was a long time resident of Newark, NJ were she lovingly raised her family. She was a sweet, loving and caring person. Lucille completed the Oral Roberts at home Bible Study program. She loved to read about the Lord Jesus and share about His goodness with family, friends, neighbors, and strangers. Lucille did not simply talk about the love of Jesus Christ. She demonstrated it by her decades of giving to many Christian charitable organizations. In addition, Lucille adopted a family in Africa and in the Appalachian Mountains. Moreover, Lucille would clothe, feed and minister to the homeless. She would minister to drug addicted prostitutes and allow them to shower, receive a change of clothing and a meal in her home. Her desire was to see all her children and grandchildren saved and serving the Lord Jesus Christ.

While as a stay at home mom, Lucille's children loved coming home to the smells of a clean house and dinner cooking on the stove. Lucille was known for her cooking, her warm crocheted hats, scarves, gloves, blankets, and handmade outfits that looked as if she stepped out of a fashion magazine. Lucille's love of music was passed to her children. Anyone coming to her home was subject to hear classical, jazz, gospel, and music from around the world.

During her work life, Lucille had several occupations. Lucille's love of shopping and eye for quality antiques allowed her to have her own boutique at Muir's in East Orange, NJ. She worked at Technar Labs, Revlon, Toys R Us, Mayfair/Foodtown, Arco Steele Company and she worked as a security officer for 15 years. Prior to

retiring, Lucille worked at Augustus Street School in Irvington, NJ as a teacher's aide.
