Manuel "Manzo" Clemente, Sr., of Harlem, passed away on March 5, 2022, in Mt. Sinai's Hospice Care with his family by his side. God welcomed him home just two weeks after being diagnosed with Stage Four Pancreatic Cancer. He was 66 years old.

Manzo was born on September 25, 1955 and raised in Foster Projects by his parents, Bonifacio and Dorothy Clemente with Manzo's brother, Henry, and sister, Helena. He graduated from Julia Richmond High School before working as a personal cab driver for local businessmen, such as Nicky Bonds and other Harlem legends.

After having his first child, Emmanuel Clemente, with Inez Burrows in 1977; Manzo would have five beautiful children with his high school sweetheart and wife at the time, Lauren Clemente-Myers. The twenty-one-year union would produce Manny Jr., Antonio, Tito, Indie, and Dario.

A devoted father, friend, and entrepreneur— Manzo owned many businesses throughout his life, such as a grocery store, a restaurant, bars, and clubs to support his family. Beyond benevolent, he loved helping others, just as much as creating culinary masterpieces, spending time with his children, and putting together new outfits... the man was sharp.

The life of any party, he loved dancing, telling jokes, and having a good time.

And in 2004, after meeting his new life-partner, Aisha Hyde, the good times kept rolling for the last eighteen years of his life. She was the love of his life. She brought him love, peace, happiness, fun, an amazing new family (the Hydes), a promising young stepson, Keyshawn Hargrave, and a lovely new daughter— Maziya Clemente.

Manzo was preceded in death by his parents, three of his siblings, Anthony, Kathy, and Helena, and his nephew, Henry "Hen-Dog" Clemente.

Manzo is survived by his fiancée, his children, grandchildren, his goddaughter/niece, Curly, countless cousins, nieces/nephews, and his siblings, Manola, Benny, Henry, Mary, Nene, and Jesus.
