Alonzo Reynolds, the youngest of five children, was born and raised in Newark, NJ, to the late Emmett J. Sr. and Sarah Reynolds. His family included; two sisters, Joan and Jessie Mae and two brothers, Emmett Jr. and Marion. Alonzo attended public schools in Newark, NJ. Upon completing South Side High School, he enlisted in the U.S. Army for a short period of time. Illness prevented his ability to complete his time of service.

Alonzo enjoyed driving cars--often participating in racing with other cars. He never incurred injuries during this activity--attributing his safety to good luck.

Employed several years as a Newark, NJ Police Officer, Alonzo concluded his formal work career as an employee for the Benjamin Moore Paint Company. He was awarded a yearly pension for a job well done.

Alonzo enjoyed his early years with his family and friends. Cookouts and family outings with his children were his favorite events in life. Attending church events and visiting out-of-town relatives were high on his list of "to do" things as well.

Alonzo became a member of Omega Phi Epsilon Fraternity, founded by the late Congressman, Donald Payne, in 1959 at South Side High School. A community-based organization whose main focus is designed to encourage youth to reach their full potential as productive citizens. Alonzo's last fishing trip with his fraternity was one of the many highlights in his life.

Alonzo enjoyed sports, particularly football and track. He often worked as an official in these two school events and could always be counted on to show up and participate.

Alonzo is survived by his three children, Robin Reynolds, Londi Fuller (son-in-law - Aaron Fuller), and Donald Fuller. He has three grandchildren, Nathan, Aaron, and Trevon.

He leaves a very significant companion, Mercedes Stover who shared good times and challenging seasons of Alonzo's life for over 15 years. Alonzo also leaves his sister, Joan Henderson, and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.
