### Reflection of Life

Harriette Adeline Waltz nee Collier was born on November 2, 1928 in Newark, New Jersey to Albert Collier III and Adelaide Coleman Collier. She attended the Newark school system graduating from Barringer High School and also attended Rutgers University. Upon graduation from high school, she was one out of a group of six African-American females who were screened under a pilot project with the urban league of New Jersey to integrate the Prudential Insurance Company in Newark in 1947.

She began employment with the city of Newark in March of 1958 at the Harrison S. Martland Medical Center presently known as the New Jersey College of Medicine & Dentistry where she worked in the title of Principal Clerk. She worked there for 11 years under the state of New Jersey. She transferred back to the city in 1969 and worked in the Newark Municipal Court in the titles of Principal Clerk, Principal Account Clerk and retired as Assistant Purchasing Clerk. She has worked for the city of Newark for 35 years.

Harriette was a 54 year member of the Bethany Baptist Church of Newark, New Jersey where she had membership in; the Woman's League, a charter member of the Altar Guild, was a Girl Scout leader, served as a steward working with the building fund, a past trustee in the Municipal Career Women and is a life member of the N.A.A.C.P.

Her most proud accomplishment is that of a mother of one son, James Roland Waltz.

Harriette has tried to adapt her life style by the prayer of serenity as her guide:

God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, courage to change the things I can and the wisdom to know the difference.
