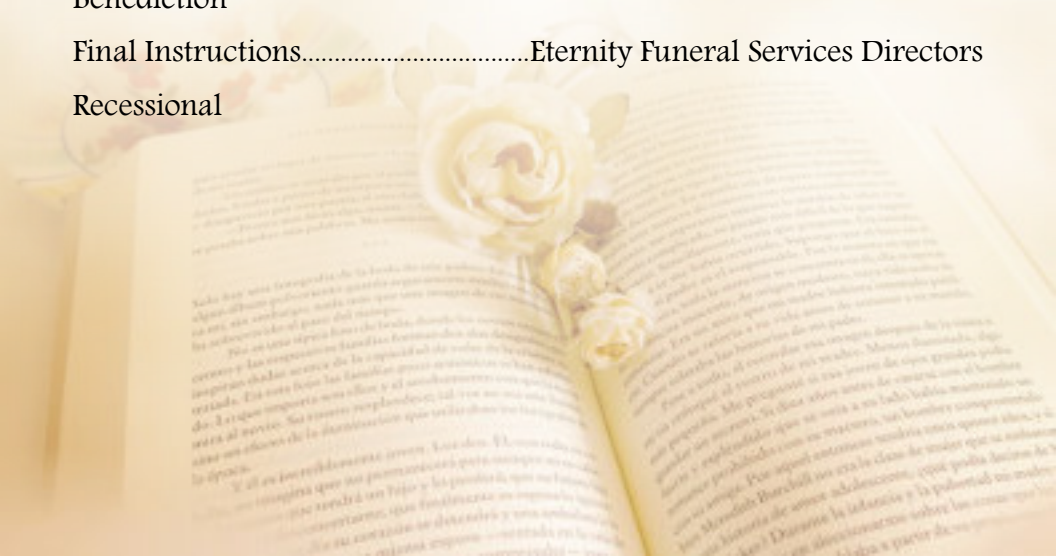

Doris Bodden was born on July 22, 1922. She was the second of four children born to Mary Ann Hutton and Percival Bodden in Trelawny, Jamaica, West Indies (Rashford Bodden (deceased), Hazel Bodden and Joyce Fowlkes).

While growing up, young Doris was given the nickname 'WEASIE', which still remains a secret to this day. In her later years aunt Doris was lovingly called 'Dar Dar'.

She migrated to New York in 1966 to be with her family. Aunt Doris became a member of All Souls Episcopal Church in Harlem, New York where she worshiped for several decades.

Aunt Doris loved the Lord and she lived out the scripture in her Christian walk. One verse that comes to mind is Exodus 20:12 "Honour thy father and thy mother, that thy days may be long upon the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee". To that end, Aunt Doris gave up her career as a home attendant to nurture and care for her mother and father full time until their passing. Aunt Doris was a people person who always extended a helping hand to others in need, even if it meant going above and beyond the call of duty. Although she never had children of her own, she became mother to the many foster children who came through our home. She was beloved by children and a humble woman whose soft-spoken ways belied the bravest of hearts. Her strength came from her faith in the Lord. Her life was a living example of one of her favorite Bible verses, Ephesians 4:32 - "And be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving one another, just as God also forgave you in Christ".

She was no stranger in the kitchen. Aunt Doris was famous for her chicken soup, homemade Bammy and banana porridge. Her hobbies were listening to gospel music, watching soap operas and dancing. Her last dance was on Christmas Day, 2021 to Beenie Man. Big up yuhself Dar Dar!!!

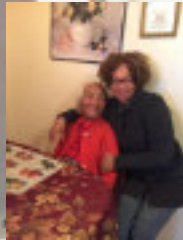

And he is mine for ever.

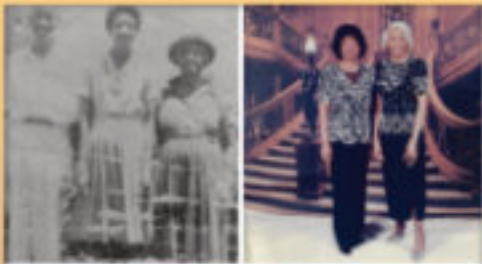
Where streams of living water flow
