Sadie was a beloved member of the First Presbyterian church of Williamsbridge, where she served as Treasurer. She was always willing to give of herself. Sadie was the go-to person for family, neighbors and friends. If you needed a letter written, needed advice, needed to know who to go to, you go to Sadie, and if she didn't know, she would find out. GG was full of life and energy, in fact, she was still turning heads in her eighties. My brother would often say "she was a freak of nature."

Sadie was born to Charles Gardener and Violet Powell on the 12th of August, 1933 in the parish of Manchester, Jamaica West Indies. She attended Primary School in her home parish and later went to Durham Commercial School in Kingston. She graduated and began working for the Jamaica Gleaner Company as a Bookkeeper. She subsequently migrated to the United States where she attended Bronx Community College and earned a degree in Accounting, a profession she loved dearly. She just had a knack for numbers. She took a job with Vidal Sassoon and worked with them until the company relocated to California. The company wanted her to relocate with them, however, Sadie refused, saying "I will not leave my family." She then worked for the UAW District 65, where she rose to the position of Comptroller. She worked for UAW until she retired.

GG was an avid reader and was quite at home with the computer. She got a lot of joy displaying her skills. She was also a no-nonsense domino player. "Man fi get sap" was her motto. Ladies and gentlemen, the Conductor has just informed us that the train is pulling out of the station. However, Sadie will not be traveling with us. She has taken the Celestial train and we will meet her later on in our journey. I'm deeply grateful for the ride to this point. Who knows where we would be now, had we not been on the first leg of our journey with her. Bon voyage GG, God's speed. We love and miss you.
