It surprised everyone because Tommy was a very smart student. During his young years he seemed to be very impatient and annoyed with the way thing were with Black people in the South.

When things didn't work out for him after a few years working at Greystone Psychiatric Hospital, he ventured to Baltimore to live with family there. Once again after a period of time Tommy decided to return home to Scotland Neck to decide what he would do with his life. After a couple of years back home he met and married Minnie Pearl Mitchell. To that union Ikimberly and Thomas Jr. were born. Tommy also gained another daughter Shanita from that union. Even though the couple separated shortly after T.J. was born they remained friends until Minnie passed away in April 2020.

Tommy returned to Greystone around 1981 and after many years of worldly living he turned his life around and became a responsible father, employee and overall great person. He became the person that God created him to be. Tommy worked in a few different positions at the hospital before moving to the cottages in position of Senior Residential Living Specialist (SRLS) where he worked until he retired after 30 + years of service. Tommy also served as Treasurer of ASCME Union for many years, even after retiring from his regular job. Thomas was a devoted father, brother, uncle and friend. His passion for caring for the residents also extended to co-workers and all staff. He was well loved by many and he gladly returned that love and friendship to others.

Even though Tommy attended church regularly as a child he was an adult when he accepted Christ and was baptized becoming a member of Macedonia Baptist Church in Newark N.J. After the passing of his longtime friend Carolyn Phillips, Tommy joined his family at Bethel A.M.E. Church in Morristown where he attended until 2020 when the pandemic prevented in house worship. In as much as Tommy wanted to return to in house worship his illness prevented him from returning. While working in the cottages Tommy found a great love for cooking. He first started with deserts then made his way to full meals.

We will all miss the delicious varieties of cakes and sweet potato pies during holidays, birthdays and just for no reason. Tommy also had a since of humor that either you got it or got offended by it. He loved talking trash he spoke truth as he recalled it. He was known to be a bit stubborn and protective of the people he loved even to the point of keeping his illness to himself to protect his family from the pain of knowing how serious his illness was. Tommy is preceded in death by his father Herbert Cotten Sr., mother Viola Cotten, sisters Leola, Cordell Cotten Cobbs and Miriam Cotten and nephew Melto Markel Webb; special friend; Carolyn Phillips.
