Obituary

On Saturday, March 19, 2022 in the early morning hours, our beloved Terence was summoned home by our Lord and Savior. Terence fought a long and courageous battle with terminal cancer for over two years and finally surrendered into the arms of God.

After his divorce, he enrolled in the Stone Derrickman's & Iron Workers training program and obtained his certification as an Iron Worker. He was employed with Local 197 over seventeen years until an accident at work forced him into retirement.

Terence married Tessa Grenion in 1994 and had one son, Tyree Maurice Jackson, who he was overjoyed with. From this marriage Terence became step-father to Epiphany Lopez whom he considers his youngest daughter and loved her dearly. TeeJay always said that he had three children and loved each one fiercely, as they all adored him.

Terence was also known as TeeJay, Tee & TJ Swan, he had an abundance of friends in both Long Island City and Cambria Heights. Back in the day, he was very good at DJ'ing and assumed the nickname of TJ Swan. TeeJay loved all sports as well as parties, music and his drinks. He had a special connection with the younger generation, and they respectfully called him "OG" and he was viewed as a father figure and big brother to many. Although he had some dark days during his lifetime, he overcame them in his later years. He loved watching re-runs of his favorite TV show "Columbo", having family game night, playing cards and watching Sunday basketball and football games with his cousins Kenny and Shamel.

The birth of his granddaughter, Symphony was a constant joy in his life. He gave her the nickname of "NeNe" and she called him "PaPa". She was most instrumental in giving him the courage to fight his illness for so long.

Terence never forgot his God in prayer, and we know his spirit will be around to protect us always as he did in life.
