



<u>Obituary</u>

On the morning of July 24, 1936, God shined his light onto the mountains of Passaic, New Jersey, where Edgar & Bessie Wilson welcomed a sweet baby girl named **Dorothy Wilson** to their family. Dorothy was always respectable in her youth and cared for the well-being of others. Dorothy's fascination with dolls began around the age of eight, with paper dolls that grew into baby dolls and eventually to porcelain doll collections. It was her passion to redress, design and change the outfits of her dolls.

Dorothy attended Parsons School of Design after graduating from high school in 1954. Her attendance was cut short due to caretaking duties at home. In addition to her education, she attended the school of speedwriting in New York and worked at Beth Israel Hospital in Passaic, New Jersey. Mrs. Lawrence continued to study about Christianity throughout her life. Her favorite book from the Bible was the book of Psalms. Television shows that she enjoyed watching include cartoons, soap operas, sci-fi movies, and baseball games. She enjoyed reading religious books and researching African American history. Her favorite place to travel was Nassau Bahamas, Hawaii. During her travels on the train, she wrote a number of unpublished books and poetry.

She was a member of Mount Zion Baptist Church in Passaic during the 1970s, however she was not happy with the things going on in the church at that time. She searched from church to church looking for a congregation that would stimulate her soul and deepen her understanding of the God who gave his only son to save us. Opey Robinson, a good friend of hers, told her about Grace Bible Class church choir, so she decided to visit. It was her love of hymns during worship and praise that set the tone for the powerful message of Grace Bible Church. She joined shortly after that visit and brought her grandchildren along as well.

Dorothy helped form a network of willing workers who raised money for the church's expansion along with women members of the church. The congregation held bake sales, invited choirs from around the world to perform, and offered constant aid to those who were sick or in need. Despite enduring a great deal during her life, she still gave to the church and helped others in need. It was her nature to be friendly to everyone. When times get tough, she always suggests turning to God, having faith, and taking everything day by day. Your life was our blessing, your caregiving was filled with love and you shall never be forgotten.

She was predeceased by; her husband, Morris Lawrence; mother, Bessie Owens Wilson; father, Edgar Wilson Sr.; daughter, Sarah L. Lawrence; brothers, Edgar Wilson Jr. and James Albert Wilson; sister, Frances W. Davis.

Sherion; grandchildren, Julisa Lawrence, Jamal Lawrence, Tyheeema Lawrence, Danielle McMillon, Alexis Lawrence, Regina Lawrence, Josiah Lawrence, James Lawrence; great grandchildren, James E.
