# Obituary

**Pastor Elder Malachi Floyd** the youngest of 8 children was born to the late Hart and Phedonia Floyd, November 15, 1928 and received his heavenly wings, Saturday, March 5, 2022.

Young Malachi received his early education at G.R. Whitfield Elementary School in Washington, North Carolina. Being the youngest of eight children, the responsibility of maintaining and supporting his widowed mother, Malachi took on the task of caring for his family by working on cotton and tobacco farms. Life as a farm worker taught young Malachi how to endure hardships and to make ends meet. Due to his love of track and field, young Malachi would utilize his sister's shoes to participate in various events including the High Jump.

In search of a better life, young Malachi relocated to Paterson, New Jersey in 1951 and joined some family and friends. He worked tirelessly to still support his mom, Phedonia Floyd in North Carolina by working in factories and later was employed by Thomas English Muffin Bakery, Old Spice, Yardley Soap to name a few.

In 1951 at City Cleaners in Paterson, New Jersey he met the late Gloria Greene, the pretty counter girl and in 1953 they married and to this union one baby girl named Cheryl was born.

Malachi accepted Christ as his personal savior in 1965 at Pentecostal Lighthouse Church in Paterson, New Jersey. After much pleading from his wife Gloria, he attended the last night of the revival. With the encouragement from family friend Robert May his life changed from that moment. He then joined Soul Saving Station for Every Nation Church in Harlem, New York where the late Overseer Jessie H. Winley Sr. was the pastor. There he was a faithful member serving as a Sunday School Teacher and Trustee. Elder Malachi received training at Christian Training Center and Collegiate Bible Institute completed with certificates in Post Graduate Course of the Bible in 1973-1975.

In 1969 after the late Reverend Russel Macedon, Pastor of the Faith Soul Saving Station for Every Nation Church of Paterson, New Jersey passed away, the late Gloria Floyd and Malachi Floyd were ordained as pastors of the Faith Soul Saving Station for Every Nation Church. Both Pastors were able to build and grow the ministry from the living room of the home of former members, Lonnie and Theola Smith to 402 Summer Street, former VFW Hall which was purchased by the ministry then to 173 Haledon Avenue where they were able to pay off the mortgage thirteen years earlier than it was supposed to be. The ministry was DEBT FREE of a mortgage!!!!

In May of 1994, Pastor Gloria Floyd transitioned, and Pastor Elder Malachi continued the legacy and became Elder Malachi Floyd to where he continued building and growing the ministry, reaching souls in Africa, the Philippines, Russia, Canada and Haiti. The ministry also included the following: Radio Ministries WWRL and WWDJ, Bibles for Africa Missions Outreach, City of Paterson Street Ministry, Straight & Narrow Outreach Program, Good Shepherd Mission and the Faith Soul Saving Station for Every Nation Church Food Pantry which fed the homeless every Thanksgiving. Pastor Elder Malachi Floyd started ministries within the Passaic County Jail, preaching at Seniors and Rehabilitation Centers in the City of Paterson and Community at large.

Pastor Elder Malachi Floyd served on the Credential Committee for the Soul Saving Station for Every Nation Churches, and served faithfully for many years with his Christian brothers, sisters in the United States and around the world.

He is preceded in death by his parents, Hart and Phedonia Floyd, wife Pastor Gloria Floyd, one Stepson Elder John Gary Stevens Sr., brothers, Grady Floyd, Clinton Earl Floyd, William Floyd Sr. and Henderson Floyd, sisters, Reatha Crandall, Maggie Price and Melissa Moore.

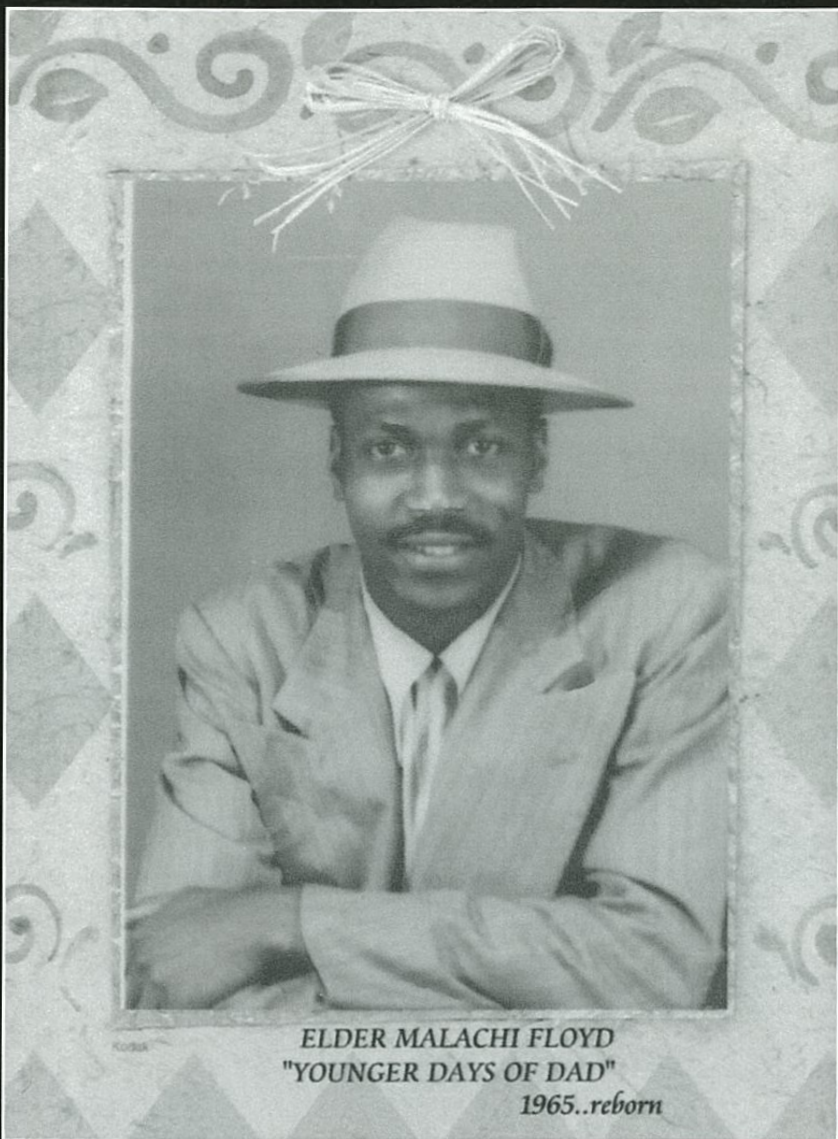
