Obituary

Jeanette was born on January 11, 1931 at Kings County Hospital. She was a good Christian and a longtime member of Berean Baptist Church on Bergen Street in Brooklyn for many years, and sang in the church choir.

She graduated from a high school in North Carolina, and soon after decided to go to nursing school, so she and her children could have a better life. She attended Brooklyn Jewish Hospital Nursing School in about 1955, becoming a LPN and went on to become a Registered Nurse. She worked as a RN for over 40 years. She then attended Medgar Evers College in Brooklyn where she got her BSN in Nursing, and then became a Critical Care Nurse working in the ICU and Trauma Units in many hospitals, Brookdale, Kings County, Kingsbrook Jewish where she was a supervisor, Unity Hospital and finally retired from Long Island College Hospital on Henry Street in Brooklyn on October 14, 1995.

She received many awards from the hospitals she worked at, and also from the doctors. All the nurses new and old loved working with her, because she was good and had excellent nursing skills.

She loved her job and was at the hospital more than home. She worked 11pm to 7am her favorite shift, taking the Utica Avenue bus every night.

She was a proud and good mother leaving behind a daughter, Brenda Brown, a son, Raymond Brown, Jr., a grandson, Lacey Moore, and other members of the Parker family.

She loved working in her garden, planting flowers, swimming, R&B and gospel music. She also enjoyed drawing and painting pictures.

The family knew this day was coming slowly. She kept telling her children "I Love You" until her last breath.

God has her now and we know He will take good care of her. She went peacefully in her sleep. She was one of God's good shepherds, she loved and praised God til the end, calling His name until He brought her home.
