On Thursday March 1st, 1928, **Dorothy Evangeline Holness** entered the world prematurely, the fourth child of Roselle Leckey-Holness and William Holness, in the town of Swift River, Portland, Jamaica W.I. She was a 'teenie weenie' child and was aptly and affectionately nicknamed 'Tiny' or 'Tines' by her friends and family. Tiny' was a beautiful, precocious child, curious and feisty with a sharp and witty sense of humor that left those in her presence in belly-jerking laughter. As a child, 'Tiny' loved to play in the river that was directly across from the house she lived in, where she developed her excellent swimming skills. In addition, Dorothy loved to read and was a fabulous cook and baker who could prepare anything from scratch.

In her late teens, Dorothy moved to Brown's Town, Kingston, Jamaica where she met her late husband, the dashing and dapper Josiah 'Dockey' Bertram. They got married on May 8th, 1948 and the union produced six sons. Early married life kept Dorothy a busy housewife raising five rambunctious and mischievous boys. Early Sunday morning beach picnics was one of her favorite family activities.

While enrolled in the nursing program at University College Hospital, she also took on a full time job supervising their laundry department. During that time and ten years after her fifth pregnancy, Dorothy found herself pregnant again with her sixth son.

In 1968, Dorothy and her family migrated to the U.S. first settling in Brooklyn, NY, then moved to Far Rockaway, NY. She worked for Macy's Department Store in Herald Square for 22 years before retiring in 1988 to Ocala FL. with her husband. During their retirement Dorothy and Josiah enjoyed their golden years traveling extensively and spending time with their grand and great grand children. They also brought her aging mother Roselle to live and care for her in their home in Ocala, until Josiah's untimely passing in 1999 and Roselle's passing in 2000.

Over the years, Dorothy was a doting, lovable grandmother to her nine grandchildren, twenty-three great-grandchildren and the affable and funny 'Aunt Tiny' to her many nieces and nephews. She lived a life of altruistic service to others. She loved everyone and everyone who knew her loved her grace and elegance. Her faith in God was immovable and she prayed for everyone.

On Wednesday March 30, 2022, our dear Mummy, aka 'Tiny', Dorothy Evangeline Bertram, drew her last breath in the hospital surrounded by her loved ones. She was predeceased by her husband Josiah Bertram, sons Raymond Bertram and Howard Bertram, her older siblings Grace, Ferdinand and Silburn. Dorothy is survived by sons Peter Bertram, Robin Bertram, David Richie Bertram and Steven Bertram.
