Obituary

Leroy Lindsay Malcolm was born to Millicent Jonas on September 18, 1960 in Kingston, Jamaica. He completed his education at the Knockalva Secondary School in the parish of Hanover in 1977, with a certificate in Electrical Installation. He continued to study electrical installation and in June 1980 he joined the Airport Authority of Jamaica at Norman Manley International Airport as a Grade II, Junior Electrician. He left the airport in April, 1987 as a Grade IV electrician. During his time at the airport, he made lifelong friends: Michael Henry, Andrew Powell, Michael Douglas, Andrew Mattis, Noel Thompson (pre-deceased), Nigel Davy. After leaving the airport Malcolm (Chin, Lloyd, Leroy) as he was known to many migrated to the United States and continued to work in the electrical industry. In December 1987 he joined the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) – Local Union #3. As a union electrician he worked with many electrical companies here. During the time made lifelong friends, two very close ones are Mr. Adams, and Winston Brown. After more than 30 years in the industry, he retired on October 1st, 2021. Over his many years in the electrical industry, he met many people and he made and kept many friends. Friends that are too many to name here but they were lights along his life's path.

Somewhere along the way he met and married Ann on August 17, 1996, with whom he had two children Lauren and Lindsay.

On March 27th, 2022, he departed this life unexpectedly and way too soon.
