Philip spent most of his childhood years growing up with his grandparents in Frankfield, Clarendon and attended his earlier school years while residing with them. Subsequently, Phillip attended the Cobbler Youth Program, Glenmuir and St. Georges High School in Kingston, where he completed his O' Levels.

In 1968, Philip attended the Jamaica Police Academy in Port Royal and graduated as a Police Officer. After graduating, he worked as a police officer in Mandeville, Manchester for 3 years and then transferred to Kingston shortly after.

Phillip soon was promoted to a Detective, at the Special Branch and worked as a Secret Service Detective for over 13 years for two of Jamaica's former Prime Ministers: Hugh Lawson Shearer, and Michael Manley.

In 1982, Philip migrated to the United States of America to pursue new and better opportunities for himself. While working full-time, Philip attended Lehman College and got his Bachelors of Science degree in Accounting.

With his investigative background, Philip joined the Insurance Industry and worked in the Special Investigative Unit for 26 years. He would eventually become a licensed Private Investigator before retiring in 2019.

Those who knew Philip well would wholeheartedly agree that he was a full fledged comedian just like, "Oliver Samuels", one of Jamaica's well known comedians. If Phillip was not telling funny stories to make you laugh, he was either engaging you in a deep political conversation, or a conversation about the most current affairs.

Philip's love of his native country Jamaica was so deep he returned there frequently for vacation. One of his main aspirations was to return to Jamaica with Juliet, and live out his retirement years among his family and friends.

Philip was also a devout sports enthusiast and was extremely passionate about basketball and football. He devoted a lot of his spare time at home watching his favorite games with his three (3) best friends - Jay, Wray and Nephew.

Philip will be sadly missed by his beloved Juliet (Spouse), Philip & Stacie (Son and daughter-in-law), Phylicia (daughter), Melissa, Jamar & Jason (Daughter, grandson & son-in-law), brothers Michael and Hubert, as well as immediate family members, Mavis Cohen (Aunt), Ronald Brown, The Arscott family, Geoffrey, Wayne and Pat Cohen (cousins), and countless friends and acquaintances.
