

OBITUARY

James C. Jones, Sr. was born in Rahway, N.J., to Boss H. and Mary E. Jones. He was the 5th of six children. He attended and graduated from the Rahway Public schools. At an early age he became a member of Second Baptist Church in Rahway and was a member for more than 80 years. Mr. Jones was also the first African-American Eagle Scout in the state of New Jersey, attaining that rank in 1938.

James entered Military service in 1943 and saw duty in England and France. After returning to civilian life, he trained at the N.Y. Technical Institute of N.J. for work in television and worked for a while for H and H Radio and Television in Rahway.

Not being completely satisfied with this field of work, James took aptitude tests to find out where he could best pursue a career. Mortuary Science seemed the best choice. He then attended the N.Y. School of Embalming and became a licensed N.Y. funeral director. Mr. Jones then apprenticed at Thomas F. Higgins & Sons Funeral Home in Rahway, in order to obtain his N.J. license. He worked part time at various funeral homes and sometimes in a factory before gaining his N.J. license.

It was a long bitter struggle during the turbulent 60's and early 70's to obtain the variance for the Jones Funeral Home at 247 Elm Ave., Rahway. The neighbors, including the owners of the funeral home next door as well as the majority of Rahway City Council, objected to a black business in the area, but he finally won over their objections.

James was a charter member of American Legion Post #499 of Rahway and a lifetime member of the local N.A.A.C.P. He served as Chairman of the Trustee Board of Second Baptist Church for many years and continued to be active in the church.

In addition to his parents, James was preceded in death by his brothers Frederick Jones, Harold Jones and Dr. Kenneth Jones and his sisters, Marion Halliburton and Gladys Pennyfeather.

He is survived by three children: Dr. Sharon Jones Warren and her husband Otis, Allen Jones and his wife Elaine, and James C. Jones, Jr., three granddaughters Shelby, Dana and her husband Roman, and Erin Jones, and 2 grandsons, Otis Warren III, and James Lawrence Jones.

Mr. Jones will be remembered for his infectious smile, his dedication to the community of Rahway, his dry sense of humor and his devotion to Christ.


