Dolores Athelia Cooke, affectionately known as "Dee-Dee", was born on October 4, 1931 in Durham, North Carolina to the late Edwin Robert Whitted and Gwinetta Matilda Riley. She was the second of four children born to their union. At the age of 7, Dolores moved with her family to Harlem, New York, where she resided for fifty years.

Dolores, at an early age, began her spiritual journey and further devoted herself to God when she was baptized at St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church in December 1949. As an adult, she became a member of the Order of the Eastern Star, Chapter 25. In pursuit of strengthening her relationship with God, she became a member of St. Aloysius Roman Catholic Church in March 1984, where she served as a member on the Parish Council.

Dolores was educated in the New York City Public Schools. Following her graduation from Julia Richman High School, she worked at a law firm as a legal stenographer and later as a typist at Knickerbocker Hospital. There, she serviced her community by becoming a member of several organizations: National Institute of Health (NIH), Business League Council for the National Association of Women Business Owners and the President of the Friendship Club, Secretary of the Tenants Association and Chair of the Social Activity Committee for Rollingcrest Commons. In order to be closer to her immediate family, Dolores returned to New York City in 2016.

Dolores was a wonderful and loving mother, grandmother, daughter, sister, aunt, cousin, friend and so much more to so many others. She valued her family, making it a point to create a warm, fun and comfortable environment where honest and open, but respectful, communication was encouraged and received without judgement.
