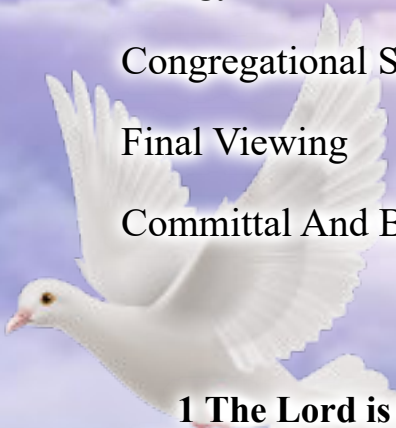

She was born to Alfred Thomas and Manwilleta Mitchell on March 27th, 1941 in Sangre Chiquito. She was the mother of 6 children, 3 boys and 3 girls, Indra, Wanda (now deceased), Howard, Tony, Dianne and Sheldon. She was married to Alwyn Phillip now Deceased. Sylvie was the last of 6 children and now with her only surviving sister Elaine Ahew.

My grandmother was a praying woman. She would always begin her day by reading her scriptures and daily word and end her day by reading her scriptures again before she went to bed. She accepted the Lord as her personal Savior at an early age and was baptized at Arouca Pentecostal Church. She worked in Trinidad as a nurse's aide for many years until she retired in 1996 and decided to migrate to the U.S. A short while after she became a member of the Triumphant Full Gospel Church. She loved her church family with all her heart and based on all the stories we would hear we know you all loved her in return. We would listen as she told us about all her adventures on the cruise ships and the many winter white events and women's seminar she looked forward to every year. She would visit us every thanksgiving and Christmas and stay until the New Years, a family tradition that will be greatly missed. We would have to go to numerous stores until she found the perfect outfit and accessories for these events she attended.

My grandmother would be remembered as the life of the party. There was never a dull moment where we were not laughing at something she said or the way she moved her mouth to point out someone.

Some of her famous words were:

"Zapphere you -meaning that is your business"

Pa connect- meaning I do not know

Ghadae Ghadae- meaning look at that

Yuh sad like sack- or sad sack or just look at sad "whatever or whoever "she was talking about meaning you are very unfortunate .

Stop weighing me down-leave me alone

And the famous- Bamba you go see am – meaning your turn will soon come

We used to call her "Ms. Walker" because she could not stay at home. She would spend hours in the streets of New York and return without buying anything the first 3 days but will purchase the same item she kept her eyes on, around day 4/5. Let us not forget when and if she actually bought the item, trust me this was no easy task. She would quickly change her mind and the very next day beg my mom to go to the store to return it

My grandmother was a very good cook. My mom would say she could cook any leaf or bush and make a stew and it will be the best thing you ever ate.

She loved helping anyone in need. She would send many barrels to Trinidad with food or clothes items for her family. She would even go out of her way to give money to strangers putting their needs before her own.

My grandmother taught me many things. To put God first in all that I do and to live life to the fullest. She came from humble beginnings, and she never boasted or acted with pride. She was a very hard worker and there was nothing she would not do to provide for her family and to put food on the table. She spoke her mind and carried herself in a goodly manner. If her skirt was not under her knee, she did not want to wear it.

Her legacy will remain in our hearts forever. Teaching her children to always work hard for what you want in life and that nothing is impossible to achieve.

When someone you love becomes a memory, the memory becomes a treasure. One that you can hide in your heart and keep forever. My grandmother will always be my treasure.
