Life Story of

Geneva Garrett Boone, the second child of the late James O. Garrett and Helen Garrett, was born April 10, 1933, in Halifax County, Virginia. She grew up in Halifax with her late mother and grandmother, Fannie Bett Jennings.

At an early age, **Geneva** moved to Newark, NJ where she became a domestic worker for various families. Later she would meet the love of her life Nathaniel Boone Jr. and soon marry. Their love story would last 31 years until his death in 1998. That union produced their only child, Nathaniel Fitzgerald (Gerald) Boone.

After her domestic work, she was employed by Drakes Baking Company. After leaving Drakes to take care of her son Gerald, she was then employed by Ariston Printing Company, alongside her husband, Nathaniel. She then moved on to Sterling Plough Manufacturing, from which she retired. After retiring, **Geneva** couldn't sit around, so she became a home health aide until her last patient in 1998. Geneva found her true calling in her last career because she loved helping and nurturing all kinds of people.

Throughout the years, The Boone home became a safe haven for many people. If anyone needed somewhere to stay, 1463 Highland Ave would be home for as long as needed. From Kim, her niece/daughter to Tirani, her cousin/daughter and many others. She never said "No" because her home was filled with love.

Geneva was a member of Canaan Baptist Church in Newark, NJ. She then became one of the charter members of United Missionary Baptist Church, first in Newark, then East Orange, NJ, where she became a Deaconess. She worked on various boards including the Usher Board, Missionary Board, Nurses Unit, and the Pastor's Aide Board, on which she served 37 years as president.

Geneva victoriously fought her last battle on Saturday, May 21, 2022, taking her last breath in her home, in the arms of her beloved son. She leaves to mourn son Nathaniel Fitzgerald (Gerald) Boone, two brothers, Archie Garrett (Bloomfield, NJ) and Merl Garrett (Richmond, Va.). Four nieces and nephews: Kim Garrett (Bloomfield, NJ), Kevin Garrett (Harrisburg, Pa.), Merl Garrett, and Lisa Garrett of Richmond VA, a host of cousins who loved her like their own mother including Jerome (JJ) Jennings, Tirani Bright Smith Bracey, Joyce Jennings Smith, Cheryl Jennings Glenn, Jerome (Shoes) Jennings, Carol Jennings and Victor Jennings.
