I'm Free

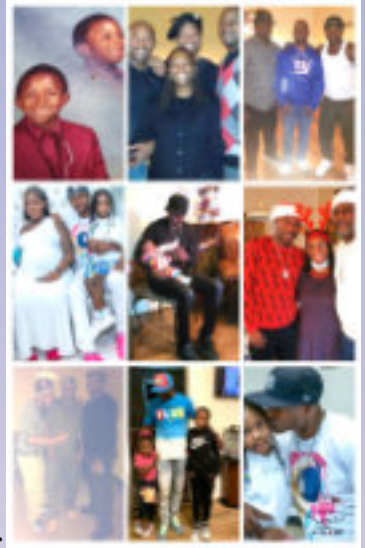
*Don't grieve for me, for now; I'm free,
