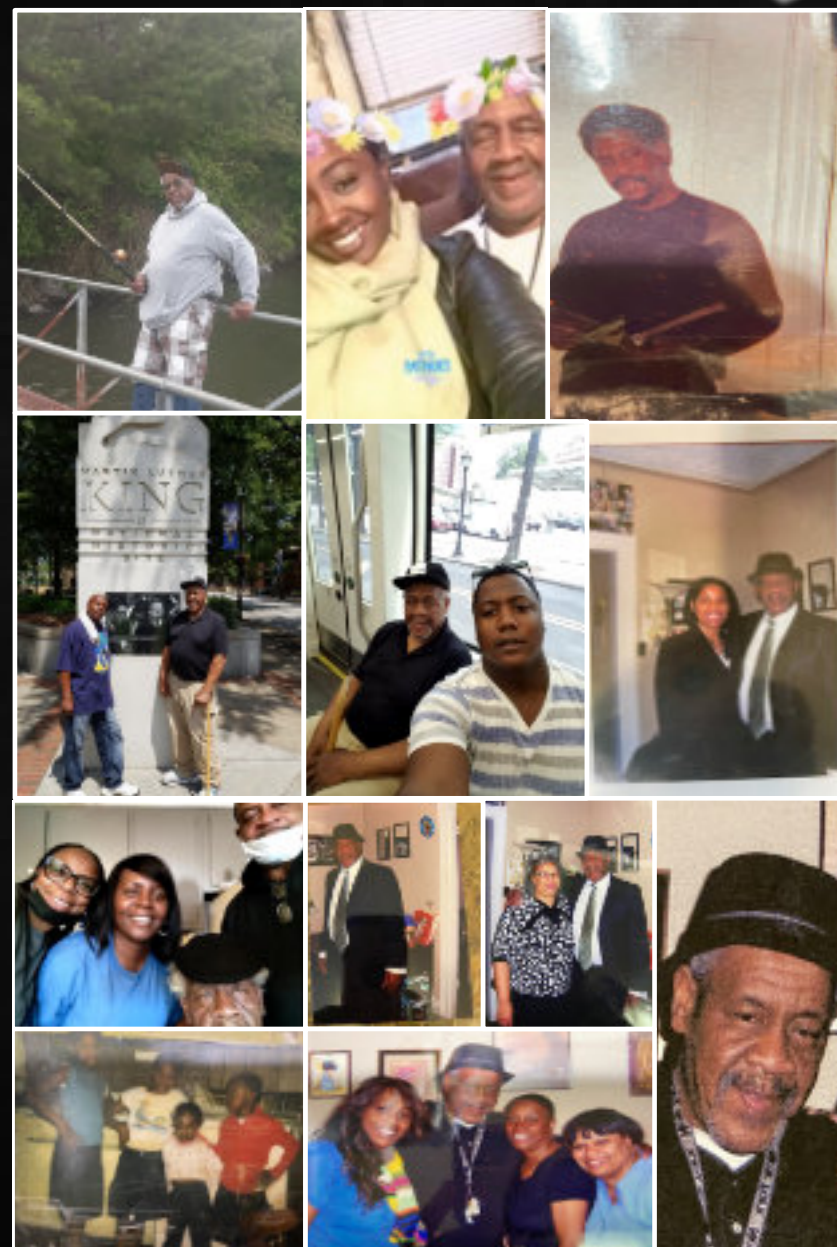


Precious Memories
