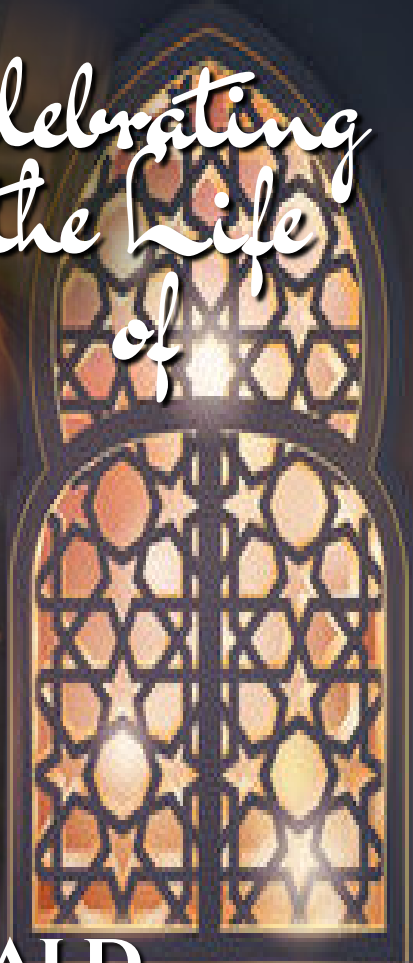

Obituary

Reginald Shabazz-Muhammad was born to Adele and James Harrison on January 23, 1956 in Harlem, New York.

As a little boy, Reginald was extremely brilliant. He enjoyed collecting and reading comic books, raising pigeons on the rooftop of his apartment building, and memorizing words, and its definition from the dictionary.

The Harrison family moved to Queens, New York in 1968 where Reginald would later attend Junior High 231 and Francis Lewis High School. Reginald went on to college, obtained his paralegal and CASAC credentials.

Young and in search for the truth, Reginald needed a spiritual teaching that would be tailored to the needs of the black man. Reginald was then introduced to The Teachings of The Most Hon. Elijah Muhammad, through his brother, Mustafa. Reginald was so inspired by these life giving teachings therefore, he joined The Nation Of Islam and became a registered member in the 1980s. Later serving as a lieutenant of Muhammad Mosque #7, in New York City.

He worked to help build a nation. Reginald soldiered with his brother (The Fruit of Islam), sold The Nation's fish, The Final Call Newspaper, lectures of The Hon. Min. Louis Farrakhan etc. His dedication and work attracted many to The Nation of Islam, turning them in to new converts, by Allah's permission. Continuing in his pursuit to help in the liberation of the black man and woman in America, Reginald pursued successful careers as a substance abuse counselor and a paralegal. Reginald put his people first! He helped many black men and women to stop substance abusing. Reginald also aided black men and women out of legal trouble through his professional legal skills while using Islam as the foundation.

Reginald was highly respected in the workforce and community. He would always accredit this respect to the training he received from The Fruit of Islam (The name given to the military training of men that belong to Islam in North America.)

Reginald was loved by many and will be truly missed.

Upon his transition on June 29, while holding his wife's hand—his wife believes Reginald was greeted by the ancestors, his mother and brothers.

Reginald leaves to cherish his memory and to carry on his legacy: his wife, Sherry; daughters, Iyasha, Siddiyqa, Saajida and Faatimah; his grandchildren, Michael, Antoine, Ashar, Naasira, and Naz'rah; his sisters, Jacqueline and Gloria; nephew, Darrel; and a host of relatives and friends.
