Charleen had a great sense of humor and enjoyed a good laugh even over the silliest of things.

Charleen had tremendous faith and love for God. She was a member of Oneness Pentecostal Tabernacle. On July 13, 1985, she received the gift of the Holy Ghost and was baptized in Jesus' name at the first tent meeting at Oneness Pentecostal Tabernacle. Over the last three years, while battling cancer, she leaned on her faith and embarked on a quest to dive deeper into the word of God and engaged in weekly bible studies, prayer meetings, and joined a prayer book study where she served as a prayer warrior and facilitator - even during the times when she was in tremendous pain and physically weak.

Charleen's battle with cancer would have toppled a weaker person. Throughout the physical pain, and emotional distress, she fought valiantly as her will to live was fierce. Knowing she kept her faith, her family and friends can rest and find peace in knowing she's now at rest and have eternal peace.

Charleen was the second child and first-born daughter of her parents.
