Obituary

George Davidson better known to many as Butch or Uncle Butch was born in Salisbury North Carolina to the late Louise and Haywood Davidson on February 2, 1939. Butch was the second oldest of eleven children. Butch preceded in death his siblings, Louis Davidson, Johnny Davidson, Elouise Glover, Frankie Davidson, Ruth Rayford, Yvonne Glover and Veronica Curry.

Butch often had that serious look on his face but really cared about people especially his family. if a family member was sick Butch would show up to the hospital every day and even spend the night if he could.

Butch departed this life on July 9, 2022. The doctors said in January of 2020 that Butch only had 6 months to live. But we know that man's plan is not God's plan. So, we thank God for allowing Butch to live 83 years. Therefore, with heavy hearts but strong spirits Butch leaves to treasure his memory his son George Davidson, granddaughter Holley Davidson, sisters Daisylee Cain, Theresa Abdur Rahman, brother Tyrone Davidson and a host of in-law's nieces and nephews.
