## **Obituary**

Pastor Mary Dean Thompson-Vaden, daughter of the late Emma Kearney, Carlton Patrick, and living James Kearney, was born Aug. 17th, 1954, in Washington County, North Carolina.

Mary Dean attended public schools in Lakewood, N.J. After graduating from Lakewood High School Mary Dean attended Stuart School of Business and Georgian Court College. Mary Dean worked various jobs from librarian in Lakewood, Outreach Programs, Temp Agencies, Continental Insurance, and Apartment Building Manager. But her favorite line of work was as Community Organizer in Newark, NJ, running after school summer programs and programs for teens at the church.

Pastor Mary Dean Thompson Vaden is known to everyone as a woman of Christ. At the early age of 11, Mary professed her love for Jesus Christ and became a member of Bethel Church of God in Christ, Lakewood. As a dedicated member of the church, Mary became a member and leader of Young People Willing Workers (YPWW), teaching other young people about God's love. Church led Mary to meet and marry her first husband, the late Reverend Melvin Thompson of Asbury Park, with whom she had three children: Melvina Thompson, Henry Thomas Thompson (deceased), and Veleda Selene-Shantanique Thompson. After marrying Reverend Melvin Thompson, she became an active member of Mt. Olive Holy Temple Church of God in Christ, Neptune, NJ.

In 1994, after Reverend Melvin's passing, she became a member of St. Paul's Sounds of Praise where she once again became a youth leader; teaching teens to conduct services, orchestrating fundraisers, and traveling to various church programs to sing and worship. In 1998 she married the late Bishop Henry Vaden and together with her husband, she Co-Pastored St. Peters Angelic Church of God, Newark, NJ. Mary had the gift of nurture and anyone who met her could feel her warmth, compassion and Godly love.

She truly lived by example and "love thy neighbor" seemed so effortless for her – in fact, she considered every human being to be her neighbor. The love she had for people shined through over the years as she fostered countless children, considering each of them her sons and daughters and loving them as though she had given birth to them. While her son Devion Wilson considered himself too old to be adopted, Mary and Bishop Vaden held out hopes until his untimely demise. Mary and Bishop Vaden were happily able to legally adopt, raise, and love 3 babies in their care during their union: Henry Dashawn Vaden, Diamond Roberta Vaden, and Anthony Henry Vaden.

Mary's essence departed this earth Tuesday, July 19th. She is predeceased by her baby Henry Thomas Thompson; her first husband Reverend Melvin Thompson, her biological father Carlton Patrick Sr of Roper, NC, her foster son Devion Wilson of Newark, NJ; her mother, Emma Dean Swain Kearney of Lakewood, NJ; her husband Bishop Henry Vaden of Newark, NJ and her brother Glenwood Kearney of Lakewood, NJ.
