Being a very religious woman, she ordered The Daily Bread at her own expense, and distributed them to most of the members for our morning devotion.

After Church service when most people will be rushing to go home, Mrs. Gyamfi or Auntie Aggie always made sure that she spends a little bit of time to greet and have a chat with almost everyone. She will inquire about their well-being and made sure we are all doing okay. Mrs. Gyamfi participated in most of the activities in the Church and expressed her opinion or made a contribution if she has to.

Her devotion and faith never waived even after being told about the devastating news about her health. She made sure that God was the center of her entire life and held on unto him till the very last. She was on the prayer line praying when she took her last breath. That shows the testament of her faith.

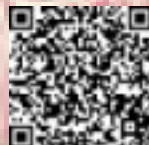

Agnes trained and mentored an uncountable number of students and teachers throughout her career as an educationist. She touched many lives and inspired many with her great personality, kindness, humility, and leadership.

Agnes served in the Ghana Education Service for 42 years. She relocated to New York upon retirement from the Ghana Education Service.

Agnes was a leader in the Methodist Church, Asuoeyeboah, Kumasi, Ghana, and a devoted women's fellowship member at Methodist Church, Asuoeyeboah, Kumasi, and the Apostolic Church, 1000 Morris Assembly, Bronx, NY.
