He was brought up in Mount Zion Ministries Family Worship Church under the leadership of Bishop Eric Samuel McMillian and Pastor Carol McMillian who loved Malachi as their own. He started playing the drums at the age of 2, and Pastor Carol would allow him to play on special occasions so that he can have his debut. They were by his side every step of the way while he battled his heart condition. When he moved to Oxford, NJ he joined Emmanuel Baptist Church under the leadership of Pastor Ruffin and Lady Ruffin. He took the job of doing what he loved, playing the drums. He loved his new church family and they stuck with him while he was sick.

Malachi started school early therefore was the youngest in his class yet always a leader. He had a special light in him and a smile that can light up a whole room. When he was little he would beat on Ezekiel's head like it was drums. He developed a true talent with playing the drums. From church to Guitar Hero he always had drum sticks in his hands. He also loved when his favorite Aunty Debra would pick him up, it was like the Three Musketeers Elijah, Rafa, and Malachi. He also liked writing poetry.

Malachi enjoyed playing basketball and football until the age of 12 when we found out he had Cardiomyopathy. Over the years from being diagnosed he endured multiple heart attacks, multiple hospital stays and multiple surgery's while waiting for a Heart Transplant. In 2018 he received a Pacemaker and later that year he received an LVAD (Left Ventricular Assist Device). He had several set backs due to infections and eventually having Kidney failure which lead him to be removed from the transplant list. He was placed on Life Support more times than I can count. But yet thru it all Malachi always had a smile on his face and stayed positive throughout. His mother always stayed by his side, day and night, good and bad times. Though he fought long and hard his last battle was more than his body could take. He had had a host of loved ones by his side as he gained his wings.

Malachi also leaves behind to cherish his precious memories, a beautiful Grandmother that spoiled him every chance she got Tommy Shannon Robinson of South Jersey, his favorite Aunty and Uncle Debra Wells and Daryl Walker of Edison, NJ. A Uncle that took care of him Wayne Wells of Hampton, NJ and a host of other Aunts, Uncles, cousins and close loved ones. He is preceded in death by his Grandmother and Grandfather Patricia and Elder Rafa Wells.
