Ivy Evelyn Johnson was born on August 29, 1922, to the late Caroline Germain and Arthur Germain, in Bennettsfield, St. Ann Jamaica, West Indies. She was the fourth child of eight siblings: (Lilymae, Vera Clarence, John, Winifred, Constance and Harry.

She attended the Clydesdale Elementary School in Clydesdale District. St. Ann. Her family lived in Carnie District, St. Ann where she attended Carnie Tabernacle Church along with her mother, father and siblings. She and her eldest sibling, Lilymae were the church organists. She also taught Sunday School.

After Graduation, she moved to Kingston, to pursue training to become a seamstress. She later met Ernest Johnson, a Fireman, and after a few years, they were married on January 27, 1944 and settled in Kingston, Jamaica. They had two daughters: Vivienne (Lowe) and Cynthia (Brown, deceased). Her husband, Ernest migrated to the U.S.A. in 1948. Due to Immigration regulations at that time, she had to wait 5 years to join him in the U.S.A.

In 1953 she came to the U.S.A. and lived in Brooklyn, New York. She worked as a housekeeper/nanny for Dr. and Mrs. Covey in Garden City, Long Island, New York, for 5 years. She later worked as a Nurse Aide in the State of New York for a number of private patients for many years.

Her husband deceased on January 1, 1983. She later lived with her daughters at various times in Queens, New York and Irvington, N.J.

She became ill in the late 1980's with dementia and required close supervision and care. Her daughters tried their best to take care of her at home but due to difficult work schedules they had to seek professional care for her and was recommended to Branch Brook Senior Care in Newark, New Jersey owned and operated by Mrs. Agnes Smith and her daughter Rochelle Smith. They were very helpful in giving mother the best care possible at a very difficult time in her life and I will be forever grateful to them throughout the 25 years, they and their staff cared for her. Mother also spent week-ends with her daughter, Vivienne Lowe and family whenever it was possible.

In June of 2020, mother suffered a severe stroke which left her paralyzed on her left side and which also compromised her speech. She was referred to the care of Hospice of New Jersey while still at the Branch Brook Senior Care facility until her passing on Saturday, August 12, 2022.

Ivy was very close to her family and friends and always had an infectious smile with warm greetings for everyone she encountered. She will be sorely missed and her legacy will live on in the hearts and minds of her family and friends and everyone she encountered.

Ivy leaves to cherish her memories, daughter, Vivienne Lowe, her husband, Ruel Lowe, and grandson, Warren Lowe. Her deceased daughter (Cynthia Brown's) children: Sonja Brown Hunter, Shani Cole; great grand children, Xavier, Brianna, Zachary; Elijah, Jabron, Jr. and Kikyo and one great great grandson, Ezra. Her only surviving sibling, Winifred Mulloon, and her children: Cheryl, and Gregory, and their grand children along with a host of her other nieces and nephews, and great grand nieces and nephews in London, Canada, U.S.A., and Jamaica, W.I.
