

Obituary

Seneca Maria Lannaman, formerly of Golden Acres, Red Hills, Jamaica and Belmont Ave Bronx, New York, spent her last evening Monday August 8, 2022, surrounded by her loving family, then peacefully transitioned to eternal life on Tuesday August 9th, 2022.

Seneca, who was affectionately called 'Nickie' by friends and family alike, was born in East Queen Street, Kingston, Jamaica. She was raised by her widowed father, Arthur Cooke and her older siblings.

Seneca attended Catholic schools in her early childhood in Jamaica, from Holy Rosary to Alpha Academy. She married her childhood sweetheart, the late Oswald B. Lannaman. They were blessed with three children Karen, Wayne (deceased) and Joan. Seneca instilled Christian principles in her children, as well as taught them how to love and serve the Lord.

Seneca's first job was at Grace Kennedy in Kingston, Jamaica where she worked as a clerk. In the early 70's, due to the unstable economy of Jamaica she sought employment overseas and frequently commuted between Jamaica and the US to bring financial relief to her family in Jamaica. It was during that time she found employment under two consecutive New York City mayoral administration; Abraham Beame and Edward I. Koch. She thoroughly enjoyed her work under both Mayors. Due to her outstanding work ethic, she was personally recommended by the administrative staff of the Koch administration to continue her employment with the New York City department of Environmental protection, after the Koch administration came to an end.

Seneca was an extremely kind, sincere and glvmg person. She was known to literally take the clothes off her back and give it to someone less follunate. Gestures like this she was sometimes misunderstood, but that's just the way she was.

Seneca had many talents, we can only name a few. She loved gardening and was a member of the Jamaican Orchid Society, in Kingston Jamaica for many years. She was an outstanding Interior Decorator. Her decorating skills were displayed in her own home as well as countless others. She was an excellent cook and baker. Those of us who had the privilege of tasting her delicacies will not soon forget her delicious, mouthwatering, black fruit cakes and pastries that kept us wanting more.

Seneca was a founding member of the New York Covenant Christian Church, where she accepted Christ as her personal Savior, was baptized and served in various capacities for many years. Her role went above and beyond membership. She would often give her time and talents to the church whenever needed, whether it was cleaning the sanctuary of the church or cooking and serving lunch to school children. She readily gave a hand and helped in any way she could.

Seneca, "Nicki", "Mommy", "Auntie", "Grandma", "Sister Lannaman", whatever you called her, if there were medals for mothers, she would win every one! Mom, as you ascend that heavenly staircase, we can almost hear the Father say, "Well done, good and faithful servant". For all the things you did, from teaching us to love and serve the Lord, to encouraging, helping and serving others wherever you went, you will be missed.

You were loved and cherished by many: the late Herbert Patterson, your loving daughters Karen and Joan, son-in-law Garth Allen, grandchildren, Marc, Tiana and Jaden. Close family members John, Mortie and Louis. Her nieces, nephews and a host of otherrelatives and friends, too many to name here.
