Victoria "Snooks" McLean was born on April 4, 1925 to Victoria and Simon Grant Sr. in Beaufort, South Carolina. Quietly and peacefully, at the beautiful age of 97, she moved on to her eternal rest early the morning of August 29, 2022.

As a young toddler, she and her family relocated from South Carolina to Elizabeth, New Jersey when she was three years old and, for most of her childhood, she gained her education within the Elizabeth Public School System. As an adult, Victoria, or Snooks as she was so commonly referred to, worked as an Oven Line Supervisor for the former Burry Biscuits Corporation – a division of the Quaker Oats Company. There for over 40 years until her retirement, she ran that cookie line like a true boss and ensured that every worker was putting their absolute best foot forward. While she could be lenient at times and leverage those "teaching moments", she was known for holding her staff to the highest degree of performance. Later, during her retirement, Vicky still had more to give, so she returned to the Elizabeth School District to work part-time in the Lafayette school cafeteria.

Now, as much as she took joy in her professional accomplishments, she wasn't all work and no play. In 1946, Victoria met Cicero Bessie (aka C.B.) McLean and they married in 1948. From this union two children were born – Ronald D. McLean and Lisa D. McLean (Dillard).

A true servant, Victoria was a lifelong member of the New Zion Baptist Church of Elizabeth, New Jersey. Serving under several leaders – including her current Pastor – Reverend Kevin J. White, she lent her time and energy to the Usher Board and Pastor's Aide. As a Member Emeritus of the Arnetha Blowe Scholarship Guild, she made it known that the value of education was very important to her. It was through her involvement with the Women's Scholarship Club where, as a vibrant and active member, she and her fellow associates were able to lighten the financial burden of young adults by providing scholarships that would aide students in tuition and other onboarding expenses. As the clock continued to tick and life rolled on, Victoria was not one to sit still. Often, she could be found frequenting the Stephen Sampson Center where she enjoyed hobbies that included ceramics, knitting, crocheting, exercising, and bowling.

Whether it was at the park every summer for the Old Timers Picnic or any holiday celebration, Snooksie was there... often times with her famous sweet potatoes and marshmallow casserole in hand. And, let's face it, if there was something that was just slightly out of order, you were going to hear her low raspy voice tell you about it. In truth, you really tried not to get in her crosshairs cause Snooksie was not one to mince words.

Preceding her in death are her husband, C.B. McLean; son, Ronald McLean; parents, Victoria and Simon Grant; sisters, Louise Grant, Mildred Brown, Rosetta Hawkins, Helen Robinson Harrell, and Florence Foster; and brothers, Herbert Washington Sr. and Simon Grant Jr.
