### Eulogy

He was who he was: a man of little pretense: he knew no enemy and envied no friend; a heart of compassion and hands of generosity; a man whose love for family knew no boundaries.

Glendon Robinson was born to Gloria Ricketts and Frank Robinson on November 28, 1961. As a child and youth, he was sought after by the girls and loved by family and neighbors. One major question he asked as a youth was "Why was my middle name not Prince?", because he knew he was charming. He had an infectious smile and compelling speech that drew old and young to him.

His educational background began at Spaulding Primary School in Clarendon after which the family moved to Nightingale Grove, Gutters, St Catherine. Glen attended Spanish Town High School and after graduating, his love and desire for arts led him to a Training Center at Twickenham Park where he excelled in drawing, producing work that were considered "master pieces" by his family especially his mom who kept a sample for years.

After leaving the training center, he moved on to start working at HiPro feeds in Freetown St. Catherine where he again touched many lives in an unforgettable way. Glendon was a great storyteller and would come home telling stories of his daily activities which his siblings found hilarious and comical. Laughter was the order of the day in the household. It wasn't long after starting work at HiPro Feeds that he started fathering children. Kemava, Kim, Rishaun and Alexis joined the family.

In 1995 he migrated to the United States of America where he had training in Health Care at Apple Training Center. He was soon employed by Westchester Medical Center where he worked for over fifteen years. While in the USA, he met Paulette Isaacs. The two fell in love almost instantly and then got married. Their union produced 3 beautiful children, Malik, Monique, and Kyana. After years of being happily married, the marriage eventually broke down and ended in divorce.

After several years of being alone, Glendon found love again and this time it was with Annmarie Henry. The two got married. Annmarie witnessed to him about the love of God, and he surrendered his life to Christ at the Wake-Eden Community Baptist Church, where they both were loved and admired by the congregants. In marrying Annmarie, he gained two more children Aldi and Robert. Annmarie preceded him in death on Feb 18, 2021.

It wasn't long after Annmarie's death that Glen began having complications with health which deteriorated, and he was unable to attend church services. Despite his health challenges, Glendon maintain a positive attitude and his characteristic jovial spirit. He was in and out of the hospital doing many medical procedures and fighting for normalcy to return to his life. On September 11th, 2022, he could fight no more. He took his last breath at 11:22 PM.

Glen "Prince" Robinson is survived by his siblings Sonia, Joy, Denzil, Hope, Charm, Judith, Juliet, and Janet. Children: Kemava, Kim, Rishaun, Alexis, Malik, Monique, Kyana, Aldi, and Robert; four grandchildren, a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and other relatives and friends.

Many of us may wonder why Glen? Why now? Let us take comfort in the fact that God in his infinite wisdom knows best. For we are not a people without hope; for on that great resurrection day, we all hope to embrace him again. Until then, let his laughter ring in your ears; his infectious smile primates your memory, his personality and positivity becomes a legacy.
