Obituary

Pearl (Ann) Millicent Shields, nee Johnstone, 96, was born in Mulgrave, St. Elizabeth, Jamaica, on October 2, 1926. She passed away on October 5, 2022, in Yonkers, New York. She was affectionately referred to as Mama or Pearlie.

Pearl was the daughter of the late Irish Johnstone (Johnson) and Wilhelmina Guthrie-Johnstone of St. Elizabeth, Jamaica. In her early years, Pearl attended Mulgrave Primary School and thereafter, Secondary High School. Afterwards, she moved to Kingston, Jamaica. There she worked as an upholsterer, seamstress and fabric designer for the Issa Retail and Hotel Company. Thereafter, she worked as a seamstress exclusively with wedding parties.

While in Kingston, Pearl met and married Carves A. Shields who predeceased her in 1986. Together they had nine children: Joyce (Joy), Cecil (Gary), Lloyd, Carl, Edward (Tony), Joan, Maurice (Danny), Carves (Junior) and Janice (predeceased 2017). In addition to her nine children, she helped raise three stepchildren, Althea (Cherry), Baldwin (Jimmy) and Conroy and her granddaughter, Sharon Aarons.

Pearl emigrated to the United States in the early 1960s and lived in Mount Vernon, New York with her paternal aunt, Mable McKenzie. Initially, she worked for many years as a housekeeper for a family in Scarsdale, New York. Thereafter, she worked in housekeeping and as a nurse's aide at The Wartburg Nursing Home, Mount Vernon, New York until early retirement in mid-1980. Wherever she worked, Pearl brought a level of care and detail with everything she did.

Pearl was a devoted member of the Seventh Day-Adventist (SDA) church from childhood. Throughout her life, she was an active member of the SDA churches in Mulgrave, St. Elizabeth, Kingston, Jamaica and Mount Vernon and Yonkers, New York. Up until her passing, she was a member of the Yonkers SDA Church for over forty years. There, she served as a Board Member and the Director for the Women's Ministry, Prison Ministry and Personal Ministry. She was Superintendent of Sabbath School, Head of the Religious Liberty Department, and a Choir Member. She regularly attended all services and duties at the Yonkers SDA Church. Every Sunday morning, she fasted and led prayer meetings at the church.

Upon the passing of her father in her early childhood, Pearl came to know the power and goodness of God. She was a steward of the Lord and a testament of His mercy and grace. While Pearl experienced a lifetime of love and happiness, it was in her darkest hours that she came to know and experience God's love for her. She enjoyed all family and friends' gatherings and events, and traveling to new places, but nothing brought her more joy than taking the opportunity to speak about God and to do service for others in his name. Her mentorship led many to come to know the Lord with some becoming members, elders, and pastors of the SDA Church. Pearl's answer to any worry one may have, and life's trials and tribulations, was prayer, worship and fasting. Even when Pearl's health declined and left her homebound, she used her cell phone to continue to minister to others. While she enjoyed ministering, she found pleasure in listening to her favorite songs and comedians, reading the news on google and exchanging photographs with others by navigating the various tools on her phone.

She passed away surrounded by family praying and worshipping at her bedside on Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement. Pearl's life epitomized one of faith, sacrifice, kindness, and generosity.

Pearl was preceded in death by siblings Hortense Miller, Gladstone Johnson, and Stanley Johnson, grandson, Maurice M. Shields, Jr. (2016) and great-grandson, Sanjay Shields (2009). She is survived by siblings Prudence Watson and Gloria Ying, her seventeen grandchildren: Sharon Aarons, Rick Jackson, Cheryl Shields-Proctor, Paul Shields, Garai Shields, Corey Shields, Keith Shields, Cameron Shields, Kanika Shields, Edward A. Shields, Jr., Natalie Shields, Raymar Stevens III, Keon Hines, Kasseem Stevens, Amarri Stevens, Natasha Shields, Faith Stevens, eight great grandchildren: Rick (Ricky) Patrick, Jennifer Jackson, Giovanni Shields, Tyler Shields, Cheron Jenkins, Jaden Shields, Kasseem Stevens II, and Kassari Stevens, and numerous nieces, nephews, grand and great-grandnieces, grand and great-grandnephews, and cousins.
