

She attended Beverley Infants school, then known as Hogarth Junior School in Chiswick. Pauline would often spend time with her close play friend's Lorraine Samms whose parents were dear friends to her father.

In the early 70s, Pauline accompanied her mother to Jamaica, where she attended St Peter's & Paul Preparation School in Kingston and graduated with flying colours. Also, during this period she bonded with baby niece Julie-ann.

Shortly afterwards Pauline returned to the UK and resided with her sister Lona and her young family in Devizes. She attended Chippenham College in Wiltshire and after she graduated, moved back to familiar London. Here she acquired her first property in Brentford. As a post graduate she joined the National Westminster Bank in Brentford, promptly transferring to the Ealing Broadway branch as a clerk and secretary.

In the early 1980s she emigrated to the USA and transferred from Nat West Bank UK to NatWest corporate team in Lower Manhattan.

Pauline was welcomed to the Spencer-Edwards family home in Laurelton. Cyril and Fay Edwards. She then developed a close bond with her brothers Jason & Machael, before buying her home in Springfield Gardens, Queens.

Already godmother to Sophie in the UK, was given the honored title to Marie, Calye, Jovan, and Samantha. She was always dedicated and had lots of fun with them, as she watched them all grow up into adulthood.

She often travelled between New York and Kingston, Jamaica to visit her mother, now Sylvia Wellington and Elven Wellington for birthdays, Christmas and holidays. She also frequently travelled back to London to visit her family Sister Lona and niece and nephew Julie, Marc and long-term friends. Surprising her sister on her 50th birthday with cousin Gloria Edwards-Epps, this was Pauline's unselfish way of expressing love.

She joined the Law firm Sullivan & Cromwell in New York, working in a close-knit team in the fast-paced recruitment department. She often had challenges to meet with some of her colleagues Fiona, Carmita, Barbara and Suzanne.

Even faced with her health challenges, she was always completely dedicated to family, friends,

work commitments, Costco shopping and Roosevelt Field Mall. She was a keen knitter, superb cake maker, family photographer and historian. If you needed to know who was who, just ask Pauline. She also loved music from Beethoven to Burning Spear, Michael Jackson, R&B and Reggae.

In the early 2000s she was eager to develop her leadership and public speaking skills, so she joined Toast Masters and served as Sargent-at-Arms, Treasurer, VP of Education and President. She then led her club to distinguished Club Honors. Going from rank to rank and with the toastmaster team they achieved President's Distinguished Area Honors accolade from Toastmasters International. Pauline Edwards was a valuable mentor and friend to scores of Toastmasters members throughout the years.

Pauline was a dignified, unselfish, caring, very hard working but private person, who definitely knew the Lord. Towards the end of her life she battled hard against cancer and shielded many from the challenges she was going through, as was her nature.

Pauline's parents preceded her in death. She leaves behind sisters Margie, Cee and Lona. Brothers Jason and Machael. Step-Mother Fay Edwards, step-father Elven Wellington. 
