

<u>Obituary</u>

Jacques Robin Charles-Pierre was born December 13, 1938 in Fort Liberte, Haiti. Affectionately called, Robin or Bin, he spent his formative years in Haiti demonstrating great interest in socio-political topics and education. Robin graduated from secondary school in 1959, College Notre-Dame de Perpetuel Secours located in Cap-Haitien and later graduated with the equivalent of an Associate's Degree from Ecole Nationale d'Application de Damien in Port au Prince. A highly organized, and principled man committed to education, Robin became a teacher in Grand-Bassin and in Malfeti. With his students and in all aspects of his life, before rendering his stamp of approval, Robin asserted that, "When you do something, make sure it is byen fe or korekteman." Robin's zeal for learning and exploration along with a desire for a better life, brought him to New York City for that better life. It was in New York that he met his beautiful wife, Juliette Charles-Pierre, formerly Laraque. Robin and Juliette initially lived in Brooklyn before moving to Springfield Gardens and later buying their family home in Queens Village, NY, where they resided for over four decades.

Robin's attention to detail and discipline inspired his work in the hospitality industry. He served for many years as the Hotel Manager at the historic Cosmopolitan Hotel in New York City's, Tribeca, long before it became the trendy neighborhood that it is today. Although Robin left Haiti as a young adult, his love for his home country remained paramount. He co-founded an organization that sent money and supplies back to Haiti. Moreover, Robin stayed deeply connected to Haitian politics and news and wherever he was, Radyo Pa Nou or Radio Soleil could be heard voluminously in the background. Robin would sit with anyone who would listen to share the latest about the country and his thoughts on the current political situation. Determined and reliable, Robin loved and supported and enriched every environment that he was a part of including his community in Haiti, his local Queens Village, and the Cosmopolitan Hotel team.

Most of all, Jacques Robin Charles-Pierre was passionate about family. He used his strongwilled nature, work ethic and high standards to forge a lasting impact on all who were in his orbit. In fact, it is his family that is his greatest legacy. When Robin began a conversation with, "*Eksperyans mwen*," you knew that he was going to impart knowledge to elevate the next generation. Robin understood the power of home ownership and encouraged his children and extended family to own property. He ensured that not only were they able to purchase homes but have a strong financial plan to be able to sustain them. Innate to his being, Robin's craftsmanship allowed him to fix anything that he put his mind to. Robin used the gifting of his hands to continue to make his Queens residence a comfortable loving home for his wife, children, grandchildren, and beloved family members. Gatherings in the home to enjoy celebrations and meals together were among Robin's favorite times.

Whether in his birthplace of Haiti, or his beloved New York City, Robin was a distinguished figure who would share his wisdom, love, affection, and life lessons with all who would listen. Robin was always straight to the point, reminding us that, *"Things are going to happen good and bad; you have to be able to move on."* It is why so many have standing calls with, "Ton Robin," to receive his guidance.

Robin leaves his legacy to his wife, Juliette Charles-Pierre, his children, Philip and Stefan Charles-Pierre and Samantha Exantus, their spouses Cynara and Leaha Charles-Pierre and Kamel Exantus, his grandchildren Nyah, Gabriella and Pearl Charles Pierre, Claude and Catalina Exantus, sisters Josette Marise Charles-Pierre and Circee Charles-Pierre and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and beloved family.
