Gwendolyn Hortense Smallwood Walston was born in Passaic, NJ on September 23, 1943 to Elsey Albert, Sr. and Marguerite Evelyn Smallwood. She departed this life at Newark Beth Israel Medical Center on December 2, 2022 surrounded by her immediate family in an all-out Praise Party.

Gwendo, as she was affectionately called by her mother, was educated in the Belleville Public School System. She attended Belleville School #1 and Belleville High School back when it was on Washington Avenue. She was always a very good student and she loved to type and to sing. She sang in the Bakers Dozen and the Glee Club. She was also an avid roller skater, and she played the piano very well. She and her sister, Maggie joined two of their friends and they started a singing group. They would sing many of the most popular songs of their day, harmonizing beautifully.

After her fathers untimely transition, Gwendolyn assisted her mother with taking care of her younger sisters, Marguerite and Shirley while she went to work. They were all very close and they loved to be around their family. Gwendolyn loved to eat; and she ate everything, but always remained very small. She and her sisters attended Second Baptist Church as their father had assisted with construction of the building. She sang in the Busy Bee Choir and attended Sunday School faithfully.

In 1961, Gwendolyn gave birth to a baby boy, Gordon Lindsey, and two years later, in January 1963, she married Bobby Gene Walston. From this union, three children were born, Jodi Felise, Bobbi and Bob Mark. Gwendolyn was a wonderful mother and loved her children, but she was also very stern. She just needed to look in their direction and they would straighten up. She would often take in laundry and work as a domestic to assist with the household finances. Years later, she would hold several jobs working with a hospital laundering company, as a home health aide, with the US Department of Commerce and in a women's clothing store before landing a position with the New Community Corporation (NCC). She worked with New Community for 22 years and retired in 2006. Gwendolyn called her tenure, "a journey of love and an NCC success story."

In 1976, Gwendolyn rejoined Second Baptist Church with her children. During this time, she sang in the Second Baptist Church Gospel Choir, and became a part of the Missionary Board. After Rev. H. E. Gholston retired, she became the church clerk and worked in this position until her transition. Gwendolyn also became involved in several other ministries, Official Board, Trustee Board, Women's Ministry, Pastor's Aide Ministry, Music Ministry, the Christian Education Ministry [which encompassed teaching Vacation Bible School], the Sister's Sharing Ministry, the Kitchen Committee, the Drama Ministry and the Praise Dance Ministry. She was also for a time, part of the Men's Ministry as well. Gwendolyn was even asked to facilitate the Word at Little Zion UAME Church in

Belleville for one of their Women's Day Services. With her sister, Shirley and her daughters, Jodi and Bobbi, they birthed, The Smallwood Connection. Using the gift of song, they ministered throughout New Jersey and New York. Gwen had a beautiful rich alto/contralto voice and her falsetto was angelic. But, she could also sing tenor and, if necessary, base. She was truly gifted with song.

In 2013, she became one of the Mother's of Second Baptist Church and she wore this title with honor. She let God use her in so many ways, mentoring young women, praying for the body, singing her heart out and working behind the scenes keeping things running. Whenever there was a question about what to do for this or for that, Mother Walston would be called upon for help. She had such a compassion for God's people; she really loved the Lord. When interacting with people, she would always interject something on behalf of the Lord and was quick to offer up prayer. And she was just as understanding. She never judged anyone, but she didn't mince words. You would definitely feel like "I need to change" after one of her "talks."

Gwendolyn loved to vacation; she especially loved to cruise. Over the years she had cruised across the globe. She was thrilled to take her dream cruise to Europe (Venice in particular) with her family. A phenomenal cook, Gwendolyn loved her family and would host annual Christmas Day dinner for her family and everyone else who would decide to drop in. She would always make sure she had a wrapped gift under the tree for everyone who would stop in; whether it was socks, gloves, a hat or a scarf, everyone walked out with something. She just had the heart of and for God. She also enjoyed teaching her grandchildren to cook, just as she did with her children years prior. She was just an all-around wonderful person and her presence filled the room. She will be sorely missed.

She was predeceased by her parents, her brothers, William, Elsey Albert, Jr. and George Smallwood; her sisters, Jean Freeman (William); Sylvia Davis; and Marguerite James; her grandson, Jeffrey Barber, Jr.; a God-son, Arthur Carl Harris, Jr.; and a God-daughter, Daleene Gwen Williams.
