

Obituary

Christopher Wayne Alleyne (Fondly called "Chris") was born to Valry Roye and David Pitter on December 16, 1963 in Kingston, Jamaica. In 1967, he and his brothers, Brent and Steve, moved to England with their grandparents, while his mother Valry and his stepfather, Neville Alleyne, migrated to the United States to start a new home and life. Chris, his brothers and grandparents, relocated to the United States to be reunited with them in East Orange, NJ in 1969. He started his education in East Orange at Our Lady of All Souls school and graduated from Columbia High School in 1981. He attended Christ Episcopal Church in East Orange and served as an acolyte. It was there that he met his future wife of over 35 years, Jacqueline. Their union produced two sons, Julian and Donovan.

Chris graduated from Seton Hall University with a B.S in Computer Science and worked in the IT industry for the majority of his life.

While in his late 20's, Chris developed a deep passion and love for motorcycles. After having attended a men's meeting hosted by his Pastor, Bishop Shammah Womack-El, he finally pulled the trigger and bought his first motorcycle. He went on to purchase several motorcycles. His enthusiasm for motorcycles was infectious to the point where people that never considered ever riding one developed their own interest in motorcycles. He also enjoyed traveling whether it was by air, car, ship or motorcycles.

Chris was an extreme optimist. His co-workers would always ask him to serve them whatever it was that he was taking that made him so upbeat.

He accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior in 1986. He had the gift of being an encourager to many people. Whether it was encouraging a workout partner to do 10 more reps of exercises, a mother preparing for the arrival of her newborn daughter who had been hospitalized for months by buying a car seat, encouraging someone to get a house instead of an apartment or providing encouragement for life to those who had given up on life. He continued being an encourager even while he was in the hospital and the rehabilitation center. Chris's entrance into any room was like the sunshine on a cloudy/rainy day.

God was the head of his life until his death. He said that he especially enjoyed talking with God on his scenic motorcycle rides. Even through all his pain, you could hear him say "Thank you, Lord. Thank you, Lord". Chris was blessed with the unique ability to strike up a conversation with anybody and would often be praying for them later on. One of his friends said when he heard of his passing, "even though I knew him only 4 years, he was the nicest person you could ever find, I can count all my friends on one hand, and he was one of them."

Chris was a "peacemaker" and "Blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be called the children of God." Out of his lips flowed words of hope and kindness.

Chris is survived by his wife Jackie, children Julian and Donovan (Aneesa), parents Valry and David (Valerie), stepfather Neville Alleyne, siblings Daughn, Karen (Courtney), Carol (Shevon), Andrew, Brent, Roger (Allison) and Steve, many uncles, aunts, cousins, nieces and nephews and a host of other relatives.
